#### Science Week

We recently participated in the National Science Week programme and all classes have been involved in a range of exciting activities that has deepened their understanding of science in the world around us. The most striking piece of science work over the last two weeks has been the arrival of 10 eggs and an incubator. The pupils have thoroughly enjoyed watching the eggs hatch and then caring for the fluffy chicks in the purpose built brooding box. Watching the changes in the chicks in a very short period has been amazing and certainly enjoyed by the children. The official naming ceremony was an event by itself, although trying to remember which chick was 'Egg Sheeran' or the other selected names was a challenge at times!

Corresponding science activities have taken place in school, particularly with trays of eggs! The awe and wonder shared by staff and children has been magical.

Our very grateful thanks to Mr Evans, our science coordinator for organising and facilitating the whole event.






## World Book Day

#### Parents' Evenings

Our thanks to all the families who were able to join us at the recent parents' evenings held in school. This year, we have been trialling an earlier start time for some appointments and would welcome your feedback regarding the opportunity to meet with staff at an earlier time.

Grateful thanks also to members of the PTFA who have organised a staffing rota to provide a 'creche' facility, keeping the children entertained with a range of craft activities.

### **Dinner Money**

Dinner money is charged at £11 per week or £2.20 per day and we appreciate payment either by cheque or cash every Monday morning and should be paid in advance. Payment for the whole term (Apr 9<sup>th</sup> – May 25<sup>th</sup> 2018 – allowing for Bank Holiday Monday) can be made at a cost of £74.80. Cheques should be payable to Derby City Council.

A reminder to all families in Reception, Y1 & Y2 that the Universal Infant Free School Meals programme is available, offering a hot meal at lunchtime at no cost to parents/carers. Any families in YR-6 who think they may be eligible to claim for Free School Meals, please ask in the school office or see the school website for more information. Children may also bring sandwiches to eat at lunchtime. We request that 2 weeks' notice is given to the office to make any changes to the usual lunchtime pattern.

May we respectfully remind all families that we will not let dinner money debt accumulate. We thank those families who make payment in advance of the school meal being taken. Families are provided with a note each week informing them of any outstanding debt and we value a prompt response in settling the debt. We will advise families if debt accumulates beyond two weeks and suggest that sandwiches are brought to school until the debt is cleared. Thank you for your help and support with dinner money payment.

## Attendance – every day counts

Attendance and punctuality at school is monitored closely each week. We ask that parents/carers notify school by 9.10am each day if their child is likely to be absent and the reason for the absence. Voicemail messages can be left on the main office phone (01332 662323) or via the school email address (admin@asterdale.derby.sch.uk).

Could we remind all carers and parents that school is not able to authorise term time holidays, unless in exceptional circumstances. Any families who feel their request for a term time holiday meets exceptional circumstances, are politely requested to complete a 'Leave of Absence' form available from the office or the school website at least 2 weeks before the anticipated holiday.

Our current attendance data is checked and monitored each week. The Government target is 96% with Asterdale Primary School tracking at 94.2%, which is a drop on the term before. The 'attendance champions' for the term are Year 6, with 96.4%. Congratulations to Y6 pupils.



#### **Online Safety**

As a school, the safety of our children whist at school is a very high priority. As part of our internet awareness, the teaching of online safety is covered at an age appropriate level.

To further enhance the skills and knowledge of all our staff, Asterdale is planning a staff training twilight on Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> May. We have secured an opportunity for two parent's information sessions to be held on the same day, one during the afternoon and a repeated workshop during the early evening for any families to attend. More details will follow nearer the time.



## **Parent Governor Vacancy**

An invitation will be sent out on Monday 9<sup>th</sup> April to invite any parents from Asterdale who would like to be considered for a role on our Board of Governors. The role of a Governor is to support the work of the school, helping shape the direction and strategic decision making. No previous experience is required as full training will be given. The role will involve approximately 6 meetings a year (usually held between 4-6pm on a weekday), plus occasional visits into school to support with monitoring and evaluation.

We are particularly keen to hear from willing nominees who have any experience in finance, helping make budgetary decisions and monitoring, although this is not essential. Asterdale values the role that parents play in contributing to their work of the school.
