Dear Parents and Carers

I can't believe we have reached the end of Term 4 already and are heading for the Summer term!

School Development Plan and governor monitoring in Term 4: We are continuing to achieve so much of what we set out in our school development plan in September and you will know that our priorities for this year are to improve the rate of progress and attainment in maths, writing and phonics across the school. The governors play a key role in monitoring the school development plan's actions and impact, and this week they provided monitoring reports to the full governing body meeting following a review of the priorities with their link teachers. It is testament to the hard work of the school community that we are making good progress in these areas. Staff are ably leading teams for improvement, hardworking teachers and teaching assistants are embedding new policy and practice, volunteers share our aims and governors are supporting and holding leaders to account. I was impressed with the knowledge the governors have of the school and its work and certainly look forward to seeing more progress in these areas over the next two terms.

We have also held pupil progress meetings this week with teachers to look at pupil achievement and any additional support that may be required. A recurring theme in many of the meetings was that children could be reading more at home to adults, to support their progress. I fully understand that evenings are often busy for families, but if you could please continue to read at least three times per week with your child, we would greatly appreciate it. In the upcoming parents' evenings teachers will also be reinforcing this message with families, and will be providing next steps to support your child's progress.

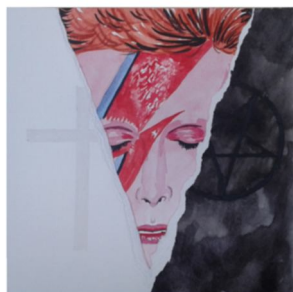
YEAR 2 RECORDERS: ADVANCED WARNING

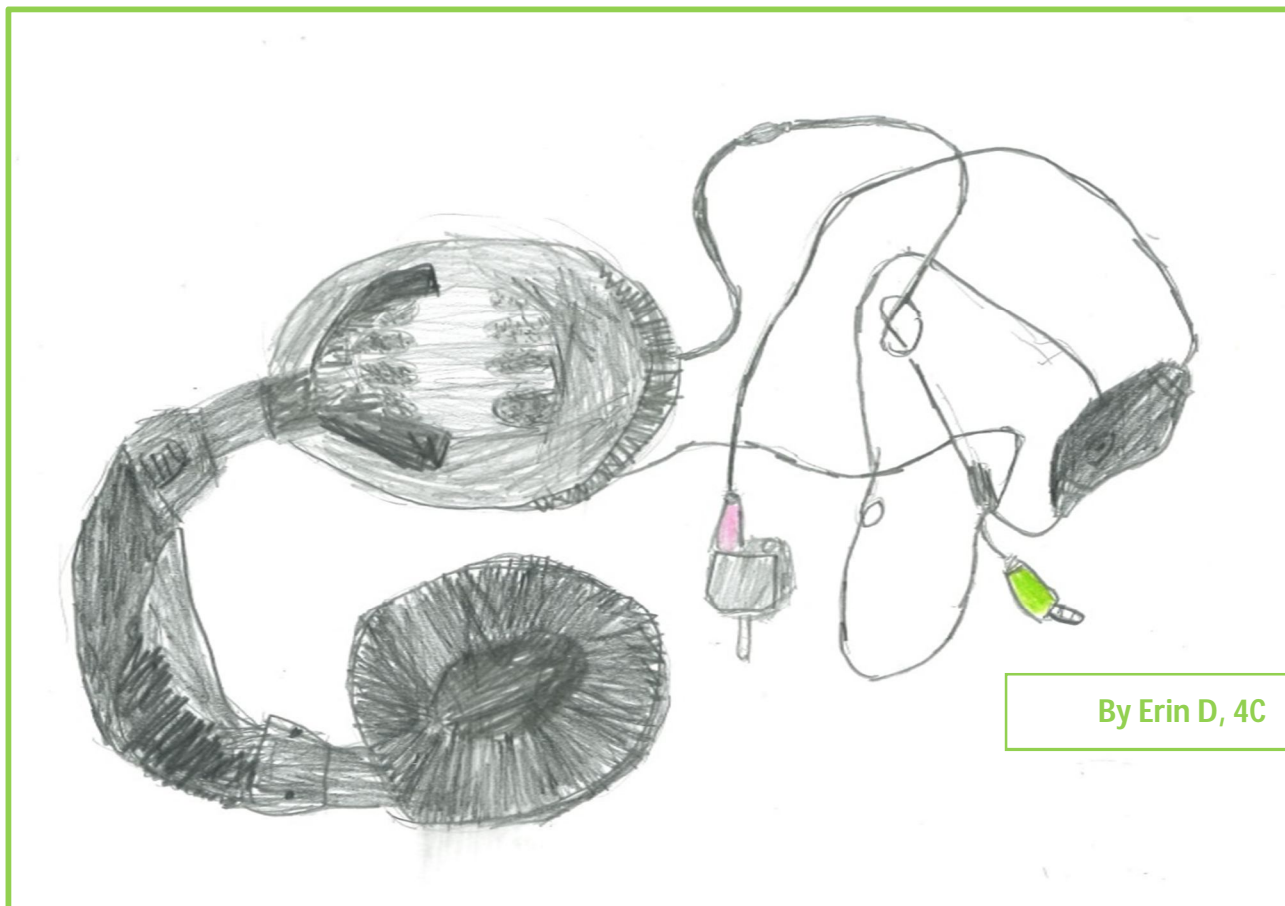
MR B'S ART EXHIBITION

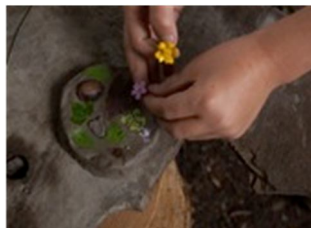
