It is essential that pupils continue with their learning during the holiday to maintain and develop their confidence and skills. Here are some ways in which you can help and support your child.

- Read the Curriculum Overview, for your child's year group, that is being sent home this afternoon. It tells you what your child will be learning next term and provides them with an opportunity to get a head start.
- Read daily with your child and ask questions about what they have read.
- Cook and eat meals together.
- Practise times tables and number bonds.
- Get outside! Have a picnic, go for a long walk over the Downs or explore a part of town you have not visited before.
- Play board and card games together.
- Paint, draw and write. You could write a diary about the Easter holiday together.
- Visit the library.

**Punctuality**

Please can we remind parents and carers that the car park entrance to the school must not be used for pupils arriving while the pedestrian access gate is still open.

It is essential that pupils arrive on time and ready for the start of the school day.

Good time-keeping is an important quality to learn. Being late every day for work would never be seen as acceptable behaviour and neither is being late for school.



Lateness causes children to feel uncomfortable arriving in class; especially after the rest of the class is seated and ready for the start of the day. It also disrupts the learning of others as teachers often have to repeat lesson starters so that late pupils can catch up. Please 'Show Respect' and 'Try Your Best' to arrive on time.
