Nursery Places

If your child will be 3 years old by September 2018 then you are eligible for a Nursery
place at St Cuthbert's. We have 52 part time places; some parents may be eligible under a
government scheme for a full time place and we also offer self paying full time places.

ting parents know very soon about Nursery places for September 2018.
