Dear Parents,

We hope you had an enjoyable, restful holiday. This letter is intended to inform you of some aspects of school life in the coming months.

Your child will be expected to undertake simple homework activities. These will include:

Reading – at least 3 times a week but ideally every day

English sentence homework – a piece of English work linked to the topic that week: Set on a Thursday to be returned to school by the following Thursday (or earlier).

Maths homework -

Set on a Thursday to be returned to school by the following Thursday (or earlier).

To enable you to prepare for some of the areas we intend to cover, listed below are our main topics for this term. During DT we will be learning about keeping healthy and putting together a healthy picnic.

After half term we will be looking at the life of Bobby Moore, who was footballer, who lived and grew up within the local area.

Your child's PE days are as follows:

Monday and Thursday

Please could you ensure that your child keeps in school a PE kit consisting of a plain coloured pair of shorts, a plain coloured T-shirt, a pair of plimsolls and jogging bottoms for the Winter months in a named drawstring bag. PLEASE ENSURE EACH PIECE OF YOUR CHILD'S PE KIT IS CLEARLY LABELLED WITH THEIR NAME.

If your child attends any after school sports club please make sure they have another kit for this as children frequently fail to bring it back for the next P.E lesson and therefore miss out on the lesson.

For health and safety reasons, it is a school rule that **no jewellery** should be worn at any time. This is especially relevant on PE days when your child will be unable to participate if he/she is wearing jewellery.

Now it is getting warmer, please encourage your child to bring a **named bottle** of water into school to keep them hydrated and if necessary a **named sun hat** for the playground.

Please make sure you name your child's jumper and check that it hasn't been washed off. Please talk to your child about looking after their own jumper and not leaving them in the hall/playground.

This is intended to give you a brief overview of the areas your child will be covering this term. If you would like more information on particular curriculum areas please feel free to see your child's teacher after school.
