Sign-in, Nursery gate & pupil mobile phones

Parents and visitors who have been to the school this week will have noticed that we have a new signing-in pass system.

This is a development of our safeguarding systems and ensures that any adult in the building, whether staff or visitor, has visible identification at all times.

For adults who are not entering the building and are,

for example, waiting to pick up a child we have added some seats to the sign-in area for your comfort.

On a similar subject, Nursery has trialed keeping the side Nursery gate locked in the mornings which has helped keeping that corner (which is so close to the entrance) secure.
