- All resources used effectively throughout the year ensuring all sessions delivered successfully with appropriate equipment.
- Engagement in FAVSP SSP activities and competitions; all years participating in PE activities/events; significant engagement at KS2 in sporting competitions (tag rugby; quicksticks, kwick cricket, multi-skills, sportshall, netball, football, gymnastics, cross-country, basketball, volleyball); A team and B team representation in competitions; progression on to regional tournaments for some event.
- Gold School Games accreditation following submission of application for 2016-2017.
- Daily mile path created around the perimeter of the school grounds; all children and staff taking part in 20 minutes of physical activity a day as part of the daily mile initiative; stamina, confidence, enthusiasm, enjoyment coming as a consequence
- Sourced iPEP for use in academic year 2017-2018 for making assessments on children across all elements of the PE curriculum.
- Swimming outcomes for 2016-2017: National Curriculum End of KS2 requirements: 29/32 pupils meeting standards (90%)
