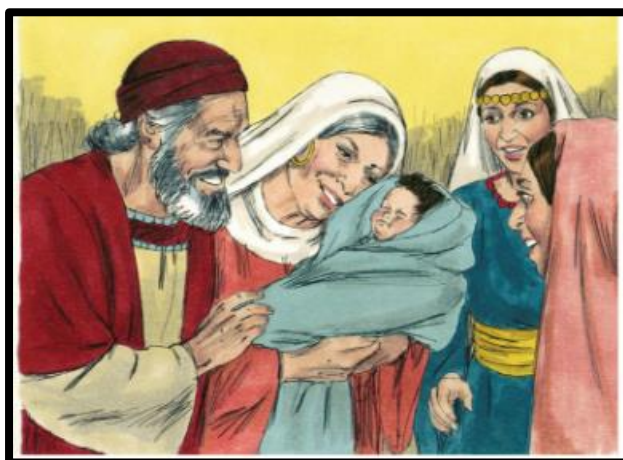

Dear Parents, Carers and Parishioners

Monday's Worship celebrated the very special birthday of St John the Baptist. Mrs Winnery began by asking the children what they knew about Elizabeth and Zechariah and about the importance of John the Baptist's birth. The children remembered that Elizabeth was Mary's cousin and that they were old and had no children, but they were promised a child by an angel. Alvin in Year 4 retold the story of when Zechariah doubted the angel and his doubt had left him speechless.

In Luke's Gospel we heard how a child has been born and both Sarah and Zechariah insisted on the name John for their child. John means 'God's gracious gift' and the graciousness of God returned Zechariah's speech. The children were asked to think about themselves all as gifts from God and to consider some of the ways that they are God's gift to others.
