



Pupil Premium Grant Expenditure: Report to Parents: 2018/19

Pupil Premium is a government funding initiative to provide money to schools to help children from lower income families reach their full potential, both academically and socially. The funds allocated to a school are based on the number of pupils in the school who have applied for Free School Meals (FSM), and is valuable funding to support those in most need.

At Wood End the number of pupils in receipt of FSM is small, however, whilst this funding remains available we would urge all parents/carers who may be eligible for FSM (including those receiving Universal Free School Meals) to take up their entitlement. 2013-14 the school received £12,989 (0.9% of school budget).

2014-15 the school received £24,700 (1.66% of school budget).

2015-16 the school received £24,760 (1.59% of school budget).

2016-17 the school received £19,593 (1.2% of school budget).

2017-18 the school received £14,756 (0.9% of school budget).

The school continued to use these funds to help fund individual tuition and small group interventions. Frequent use of achievement/assessment data checked the effectiveness of these interventions, the results of which resulted in the school adjusting its techniques accordingly. All teachers take responsibility for the progress of the Pupil Premium children within their classes.

Individual Tuition	To provide focused 1:1 additional support in key areas.
Small group interventions	To provide focused additional support in key areas as part of a group.
Provision of a Learning Support Assistant	To provide focused additional support on a day to day basis within class.
Helping with the cost of extra-curricular lessons or/and school trips	To enhance the curriculum, ensuring children are able to participate, and to give the children the opportunity to experience new and challenging activities.
Uniform and/or educational resources	To provide uniform to ensure the PPG children feel inclusive within the school community.
Measuring the impact of PPG spending	
The school evaluates and reviews the impact of this support at the end of each term, evaluating academic progress as well as how self-confidence develops as a consequence of the interventions provided. Pupil Premium progress is reported to governors termly.
