We have reached the end of another action-packed, enjoyable and successful school year. The children have all worked incredibly hard and should be proud of their achievements. It was wonderful to read their reports and hear about the successes they have had throughout the year. The teachers will be sad to pass on their current class but are all looking forward to starting a new chapter and working with their new classes in September.

This term itself has been extremely busy with many events, trips and themed days. All the children have been involved in and thoroughly enjoyed the STEAM sessions on Friday afternoons. A big thank you to Mrs Darbinson who led a STEAM day for our KS2 children which involved the children designing and making load bearing structures. Each class has been learning more about the countries they had for their World Cup sweepstakes. We also had a splendid World Cup morning which involved the children travelling with their passport to different countries, where they learned new things and took part in activities including German sausage tasting and making Brazilian carnival hats. KS2 also enjoyed a French Day. The children participated in different activities including attending a French café and learning about the French artist – Claude Monet.

In the latter part of the summer term Year 3 visited Wassand Hall, Year 4 visited Dalby Forest, Year 1 children attended the Little Big Sing and Year 6 plus Glee Club, attended The Big Sing. Our Year 2 children celebrated their annual wedding with a visit to St Peter's church where they acted out a mock wedding followed by a celebration back at school. Our JTAs completed the 'Bling a Bike to School Day' and 'Walk to School Week' and there were prizes given out to the winners. The children who attend Gardening Club very competently spoke to The Village in Bloom judges and showed them around the school grounds.

Many of these events, days and activities were shared on our twitter feed and we believe that this is the best way of instantly sharing what we do in school. Can you tell us a little bit about yourself?
