Bible Memory

Every adult, teenager and young person is being challenged to commit **Matthew 6:31-33** to memory during the month of March. In this passage of scripture, Jesus gave His disciples



the following advice: ***“Therefore take no thought, saying, What shall we eat? or, What shall we drink? or, Wherewithal shall we be clothed? (For after all these things do the Gentiles seek:) for your heavenly Father knoweth that ye have need of all these things. But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.”***



The Lord's Supper

Before His arrest and crucifixion on the cross, Jesus met with His disciples to observe a Jewish tradition known as the Passover. Knowing that He would be sacrificed for the sins of the whole

world, Jesus instituted a new ordinance for all who would call upon His name as Saviour. This ordinance is known as the Lord's Supper and was given to the church to observe in remembrance of Jesus' death on the cross. While everyone is invited to observe this memorial service with our church on Wednesday, **March 28th**, pastor asks that only members of the church participate in receiving the Lord's Supper.

Resurrection Sunday

The sacrificial death of Jesus on the cross and His glorious resurrection from the tomb work hand-in-hand to give mankind both forgiveness and hope. The Apostle Paul wrote that if



Jesus had not resurrected from the grave, then ***“we (believers) are of all men most miserable.”*** Instead of being miserable, we are joyous because Jesus is not dead...He is risen! Sunday, **April 1st**, our church will be celebrating the resurrection of Jesus Christ with one morning service at 10 AM for all ages.
