As a leader, your effective or ineffective use of personal and positional power is one of the most critical factors in your success. THE POWER LAB is a 2-day experience to recognize, understand, and re-deploy your own power in service of your purpose.

The Power-lab is designed to facilitate your learning; it's not a lecture-based course. Yes, the course is grounded in a variety of resources selected rigorously for their own value to you as a learner, but we learn about power by experience. Our aspiration is to make of this course a very personal experience for you; we designed it with the intent to facilitate your own learning on power at a deeply personal level through an intensive experiential design. (That means, NO POWERPOINT!).

Why attending the Power-lab?

From bosses to parents, politicians to protesters, power is in the hands of everyone, everywhere. And yet we struggle to use and understand it. We need a better approach to power. People want to use their power more effectively, to make an impact, to work across difference, and to solve our complex social problems. But when we use power poorly, those around us suffer and become disengaged. As a result, we lose their valuable contributions.

Do you see some of these common power problems in your organizations, teams, and clients?

- Disengagement: Micromanagement and other disempowering behaviors lead to resignation, apathy, and disengagement. Leaders who use personal power well create more engaged teams, with higher levels of commitment, follow-through, and creativity.
- "Come ready to get to work! There is no PowerPoint and a lot of energy and buzz in these classes. It's not like you're going to school. It's active. It's innovative and transformational. The best part is that what you learn you can apply the very next day! – Power Lab participant
- Difficulty influencing without authority: When leaders
 have only one kind of power at their disposal, such as their positional authority or expertise, they
 aren't able to influence up, down, across, and outside the organization. Getting work done in today's
 organizations increasingly requires a fluid and contextually independent power to influence
 stakeholders across and outside the organization.
- **Avoiding conflict and difficult conversations**: Underuse of power is as harmful as overuse. Timid leaders fail to confront problems, keep meetings on track, set deadlines, and hold people accountable. Personal power is essential for getting results, whether it's to develop people, hold tough conversations, or swim against the current when necessary.
