- Don't vent or complain. Specifically when it comes to organizations, politics, religion -you need to know that others are looking at what you post and will judge you accordingly.
- Be cautious of friend requests. Don't accept anyone and everyone. Make sure that you know the people you are accepting.
- Avoid using location services.

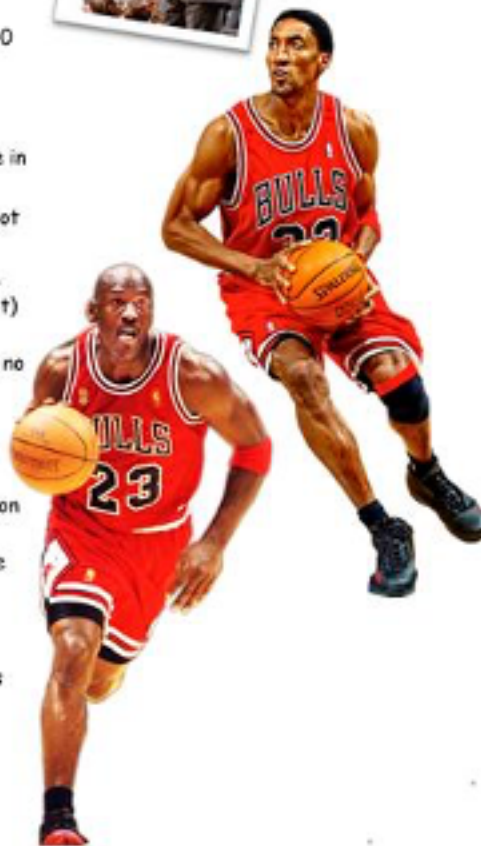

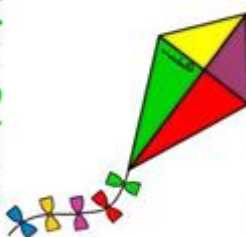
