Greetings from Zuni and Navajo Country,

February and March have been a blizzard of activity! We began the month of February traveling to churches in KS, AR, TX and OK. We were so blessed in visiting some of our relatives as well as family in Christ in the churches we traveled to. We left a New Mexico snow storm behind and returned to another one that turned out to be somewhat of a blizzard that had us digging out just so we could make it to church on Sunday!

We were back in New Mexico for a few weeks when we had discovered by going to the dentist here that Amanda had a very serious abscessed tooth that would require a dental surgeon's care. So again to AR we would go for another week to have dental surgery. Praise the Lord that Amanda fully recovered and we made the 2,000 mi round trip in 4 days without incident!

The grief support group has been making great progress with new people in the Pinehill (Navajo) area, in the past 8 weeks we have been able to give clear presentations of the Gospel to 8 men and women from the area whom we have not had previous contact with before. Our 2 hour sessions consist of singing a few hymns, prayer, study through a Biblical grief support curriculum, time of testimony and burden sharing from those who come as well as preaching and illustrating a Bible truth. A few weeks back the weather was bad and no one showed up, but for an hour the Director of the Behavioral Health Dept. asked us questions of religion and the Bible, genuinely seeking answers for the questions that he had. Pray for Anderson's salvation.

Almost every March since we came here we have taken a group of men to a men's conference, this time we had 8 men and 2 boys pack into a van and head off to Williams, AZ. God really used it to work in the lives of some of the men.

Irwin has been searching for truth in his life seriously for the past few months, he is coming to church, the men's meeting and wanting to have Bible studies. His greatest need is salvation and has many things to work through in his heart and mind. In contrast to Irwin, I have witnessed to his brother Uriah recently and his mind seems to be made up about Jesus, God, heaven and hell and his own righteousness. One is searching the other seems to be settled, many of their beliefs are the same but their heart's attitude is vastly different. Pray that they both will come to repentance and faith in Jesus Christ alone!

We are in a spiritual battle for the souls of people, and quite literally I have seen the parable of the sower that Jesus proclaimed two millennia ago be lived out hundreds of times in the lives of the people who God has called us to. The enemy actively steals the Word from reaching the heart, many times the world and its pleasures have choked the Word, and trouble and trial has turned many from bearing fruit, but it is for the Good ground that we sow the seed and anticipate to see fruit again and again.

Thank you all for your faithfulness to pray for and support our efforts to reach the lost and establish churches to the Glory of God in Zuni and Navajo land.
