



THE CHALLENGE

The Art Institutes (Ai) is one of the best-known creative schools in the U.S., with locations across North America. Their biggest enrollment event is their monthly Open House, during which prospective students tour the school, learn about programs, and have the opportunity to apply.

The Open House event itself left something to be desired. With no comprehensive marketing strategy in place to support it, it was a stale, monotonous, and disorganized affair, leading to a steady decrease in RSVPs, attendance, and applications. A creative life is ...

THE RESULTS

Our new marketing strategy paid off right away. By segmenting our audience, we were able to focus in on the right people, creating the following results:


- Marketing waste factor was cut by 40%.
- By centralizing the production and mailing of the invitations, we were able to save each campus more than \$4,000 per event.
- The invitations increased RSVPs by 77% year over year and by 60% event over event.

The new Open House experience improved both the same-day and post-event conversions. Fifty-two percent of people who attended the new event applied for admission to the school—a 17% increase. We also saw a 26% increase in the appointment schedule rate, increasing the likelihood to start school.











THE CHALLENGE

Duarte Unified School District (DUSD) is a smaller school district in Southern California surrounded by much larger, established districts. A negative perception of the schools in DUSD carried over from the city of Duarte's historic crime rate and past gang activity. School enrollment had been declining for many years, losing millions of dollars in funding from the state; teacher and staff morale was down, and lack of city support and families moving to schools outside the district created a depressed state within DUSD. A new and progressive Superintendent joined DUSD with the vision and energy to fuel a needed cultural shift, and VDS was brought on board to help.



RESULTS

Over 500 people attended the event—families who lived in Duarte but petitioned to have their students attend other districts, families who moved out of the district and were considering returning, and current families who wanted to know more about the schools their students were currently enrolled in. While event attendance was the main goal, a secondary effort was for people to sign up at the event to attend an individual school tour at a later date. To date, 215 school tours have occured as a result of the Sneak Peek.







THE CHALLENGE

The California School of the Arts – San Gabriel Valley (CSArts-SGV) will be Orange County School of the Arts' (OCSA) first satellite campus. For the past 30 years, this award-winning public charter school has been known for providing unrivaled arts training combined with rigorous academic programs to aspiring young artists.

Our engagement was to identify an audience for a series of Preview Day events that were to take place within a few short weeks. In addition to meeting the school's incredibly high expectations, we were faced with significant challenges such as lacking a physical campus, an unidentified and not-yet-engaged audience, and undiscovered target demographics. We were also working with a strategic budget, demanding focused media and implementation, and, most importantly, we needed to generate lightning-quick results.

We took this opportunity to make an unforgettable impact: take OCSA's award-winning education reputation and pair it with our methodology—which includes data science, industry-leading research, enrollment marketing strategies, and unparalleled creative—to promote the school, drastically drive attendance efforts for Preview Day events, and get a positive message out to the community and prospective families.

THE RESULTS

From the beginning of our partnership with CSArts to their first Preview Day, we had a short window of time to produce results. We delivered—on time and on budget.

We managed to drive awareness and excitement around a school that did not yet exist, around a district that was unfamiliar. We were also able to use our understanding of the education sector, targeted communications, and predictive modeling tools to create a valuable list of prospective families for enrollment. We helped CSArts uncover strong prospective student leads with incredible precision and generate an extensive database to give the school a strategic advantage.

From the first Preview Day in October 2016 to the last one in February 2017, more than 6800 potential families attended the events, with approximately 2500 RIFs (Request for Information Forms) filled.

Because of our work, CSArts was able to surpass its 840-student enrollment goal by generating more than 900 applications to date (February 2017), with a few more months until the start of the school year in August.

THE CHALLENGE


Academy of Art University offers innovative arts education in San Francisco and online. They have a comprehensive selection of programs, which generates search engine traffic from people interested in a wide range of artistic pursuits.


This traffic was being directed to the same location: the school's home page. This provided a less-than-optimal user experience, making it difficult for prospective students to find information about their program of choice. There also wasn't any system in place to gather contact information and track their interactions. This lack of system and reporting made it difficult for the school to implement a cost-effective and compelling marketing plan.

We saw an opportunity to kill two (or three) birds with one stone: give prospective students a better online experience with AAU and improve the school's marketing outcomes while decreasing costs.

THE RESULTS

The landing pages had an immediate impact. Within the first 90 days, we were able to reduce AAU's cost per enrollment by 50%; within six months, we had reduced it by a staggering 70%. We were also able to remove more than 70% of the school's ineffective marketing efforts, freeing up time and budget to focus on activities that had better outcomes.
