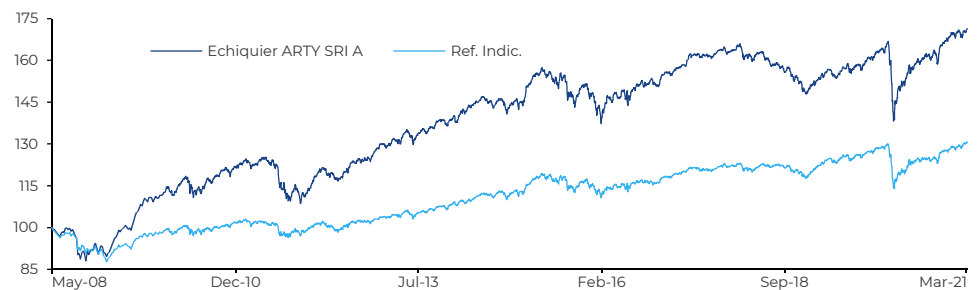
Fund Manager comments

Echiquier ARTY SRI A turned in a positive monthly performance of 1.88% and of 1.82% year-to-date.

The strong rebound of the equity markets was reflected in all types of stocks: ASML once again stood out during the current phase of global semiconductor shortages. DEUTSCHE TELEKOM benefited from the prospects of its American subsidiary, which announced a major share buyback programme. And ABINBEV recovered strongly due to the success of the worldwide vaccination campaigns, which suggest that sports competitions will soon resume. The month was rich in movements for the bond allocation, which resisted well to the volatility induced by long rates. We made a number of switches to take advantage of higher gradients on signatures such as ELIS, CRÉDIT AGRICOLE and IBERDROLA (the latter two through subordinated debt). The considerable level of activity in the primary market allowed us to integrate ORPEA 2028, NIDEC 2026 and ARVAL 2024 into the fund. The sale of our TOTAL and TELEFONICA (hybrid) positions contributed to the selective reduction of risk. Finally, our exposure to CRÉDIT SUISSE was sold at the end of the month following the setbacks related to the bank's exposure to the Archegos fund.

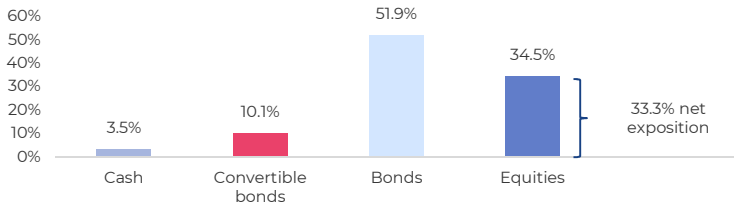

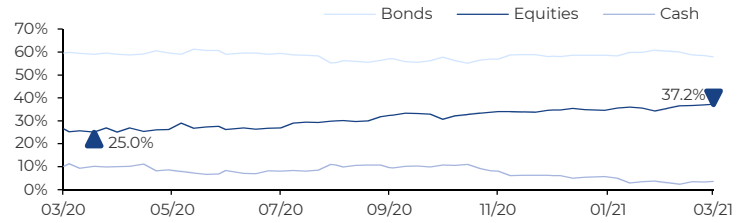

Asset class breakdown



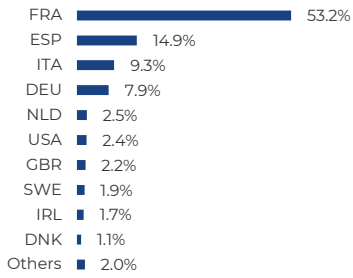

Real exposure per asset class over 1 year



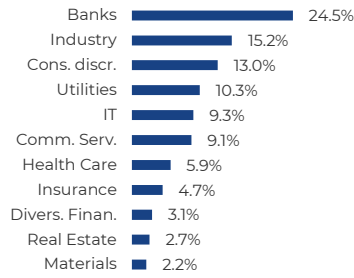

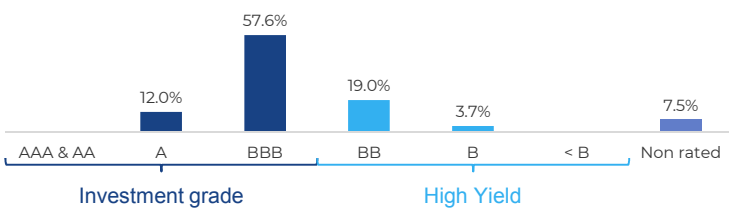

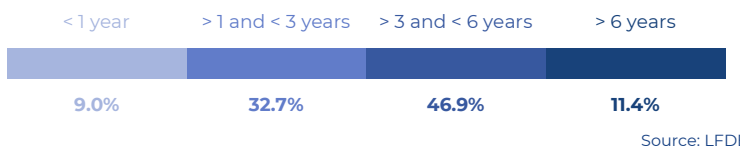

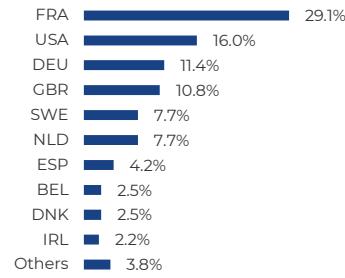
Fixed rate bonds maturity breakdown (calculation carried out at the next call date)

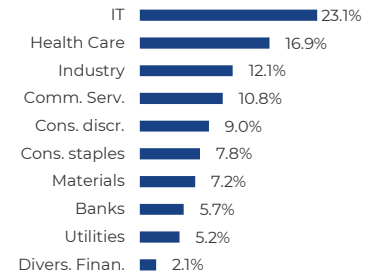
Equity Component

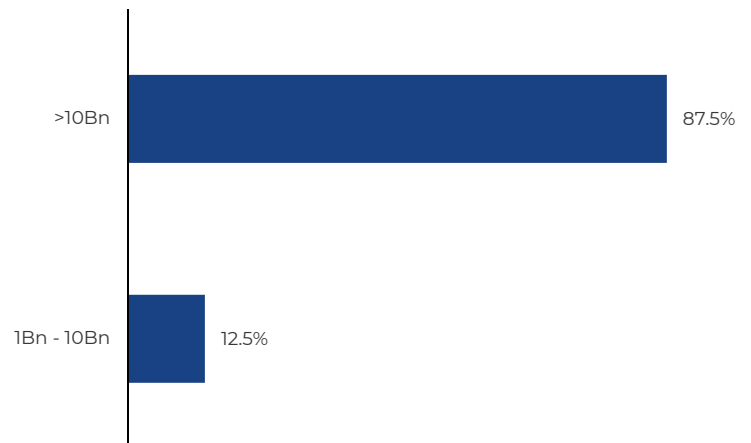

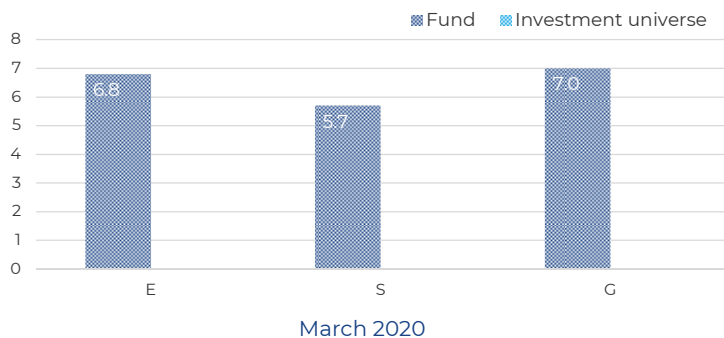

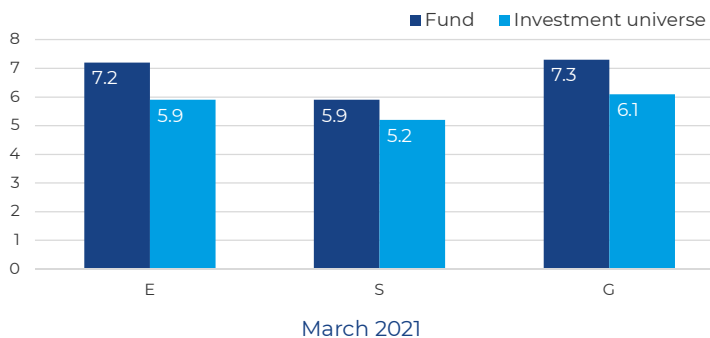
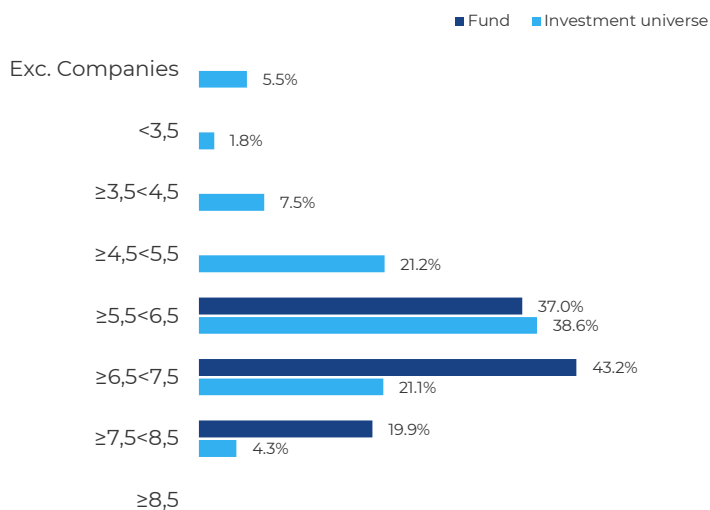

Average scores compared to the investment universe*

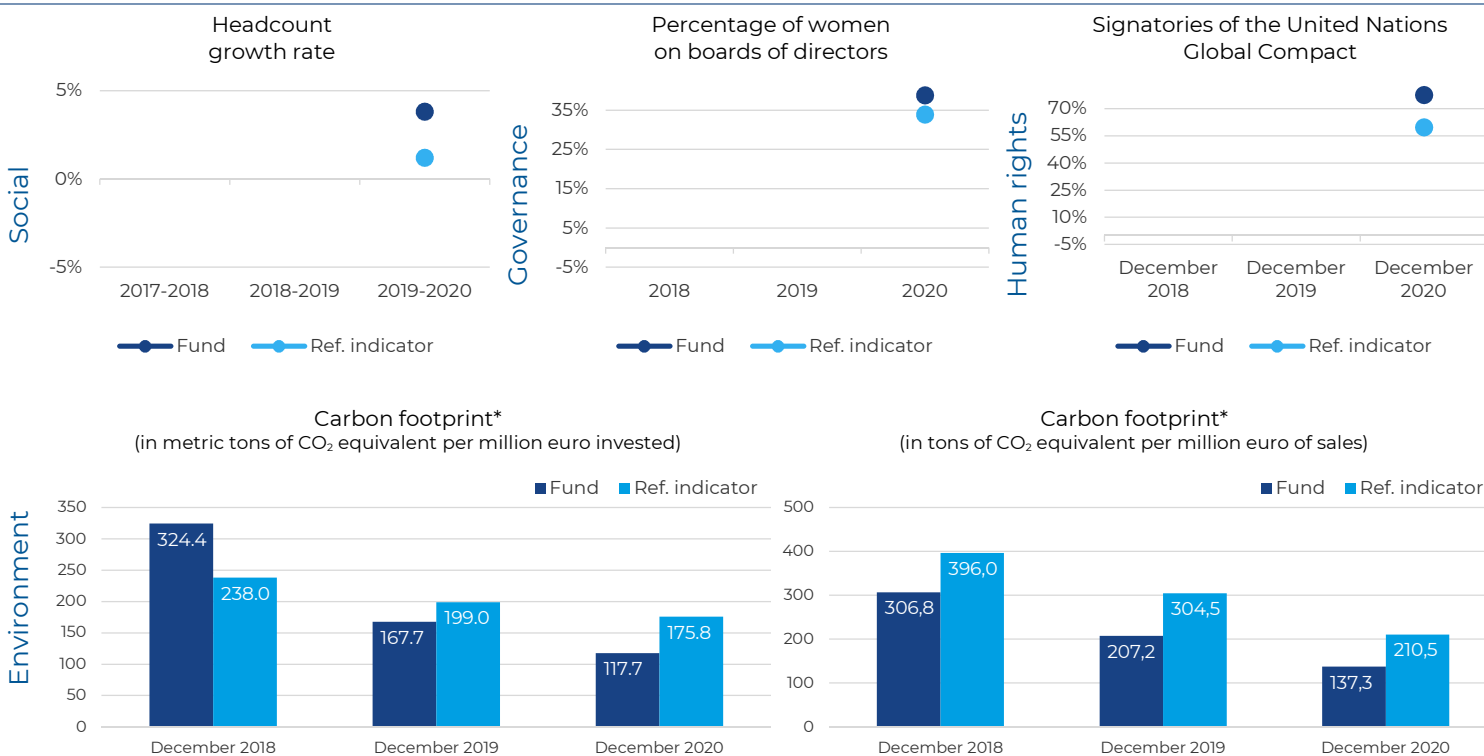


Distribution of ESG ratings of the fund and the investment universe*

Comment

La Financière de l'Echiquier (LFDE) is adopting an ambitious climate strategy and adapting its climate governance. This strategy is broken down into nine commitments for clients and companies that go beyond the recommendations of the Task Force on Climate-related Financial Disclosures (TCFD). LFDE, a pioneer in responsible investment in France, is deploying the pragmatic and transparent strategy in combination with an annual evaluation and review process in order to respond to the climate emergency. Designed in partnership with I Care & Consult, the ambitious plan includes training in climate-finance issues for LFDE's Board of Directors and Executive Committee, as well as for all of its teams, in order to integrate climate issues into its various businesses and decision-making processes. Its scope is identical to that of LFDE's approach for environmental, social and governance (ESG) integration. The strategy is available on the LFDE website under "Responsible Investment – To find out more".
