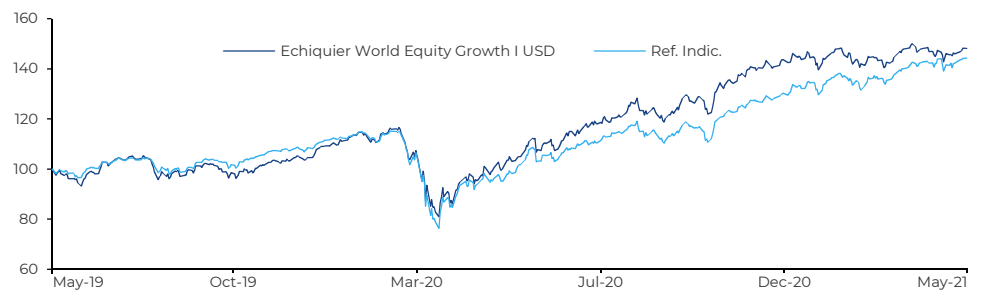
Fund Manager comments

Echiquier World Equity Growth I USD turned in a positive monthly performance of 0.90% and of 3.06% year-to-date.

May brought some additional underperformance to the fund as the weaker dollar held back returns. Some of the worst performances for the month came from our big winners, all US companies, from last year, such as Thermo Fisher, Amazon and Disney, while at the top of the performance list were our Latin American companies, such as Mexican retailer FEMSA, as well as banks Banorte, Credicorp, and Itau Unibanco as dollar weakness benefited emerging market exposures. In terms of major changes during the month, the fund exited healthcare company Becton Dickinson on a mixed earnings report. Additionally, Mastercard was sold out of the fund as it reached price objectives. The fund did add to its current holdings in Disney, Marriott and European retailer Inditex during the month as improving vaccination rates should lead to a rapid expansion in consumer spending. We think the coming Economic Boom will be the next trend to drive future performance and, while we might have been early on this call, we are sticking to this investment thesis.

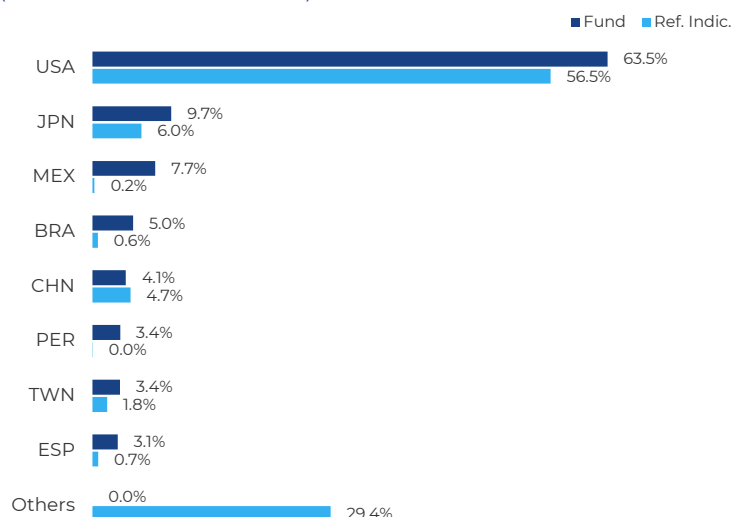

Geographic breakdown

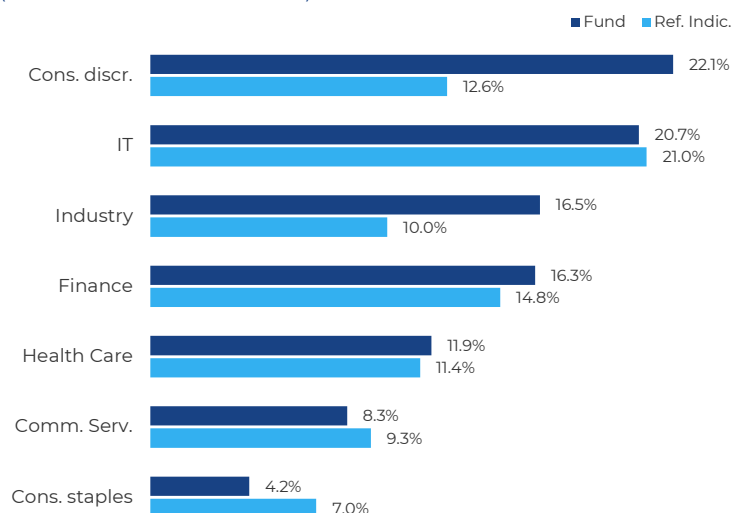
(% of the net assets without cash)

Sector breakdown (GICS)

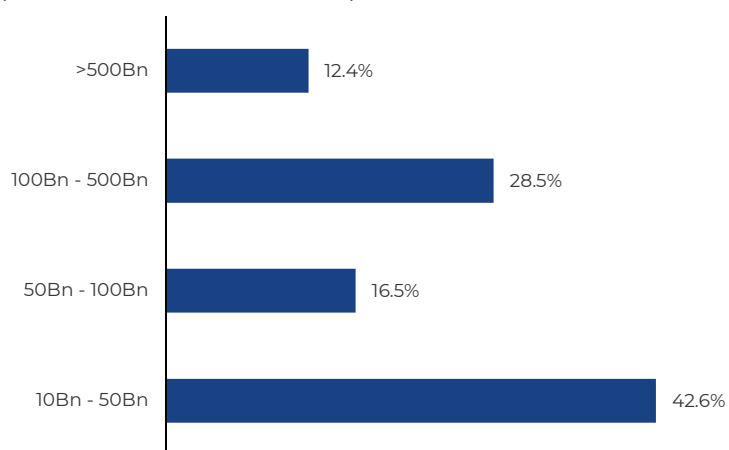
