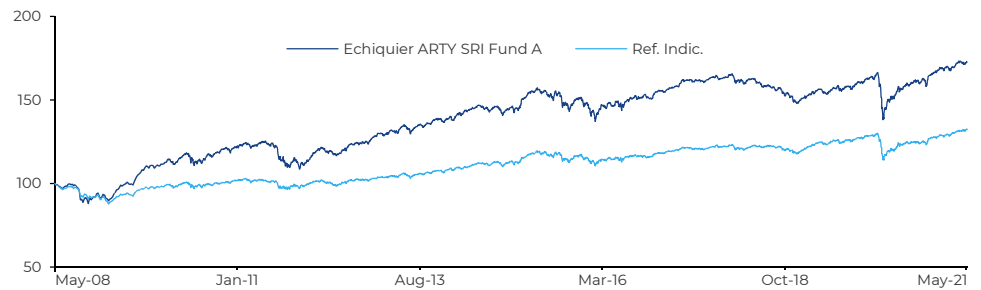
Fund Manager comments

Echiquier ARTY SRI Fund A turned in a positive monthly performance of 0.11% and of 2.88% year-to-date.

The equity indices continued to rise thanks to the familiar recipe of accommodative central banks, very good quarterly results and above all, a bright outlook with the end of lockdowns in Europe. We took this opportunity to strengthen stocks recently added to the portfolio, such as BOUYGUES and TAIWAN SEMICONDUCTOR. We also returned to WALT DISNEY, which has successfully transitioned to streaming and is set+ to benefit considerably from its unique positioning in the amusement park segment following the gradual reopening of the latter. Finally, we made two switches on health stocks by selling GRIFOLS, which seems to be struggling under pressure from new competitors, in favour of RECORDATI, a small Italian pharmaceutical company with significant growth potential. We also swapped BECTON DICKINSON for THERMO FISHER, which offers more opportunities in the medical equipment sector for the laboratory and pharmaceutical industry.

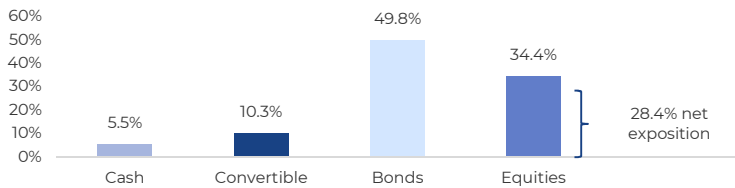

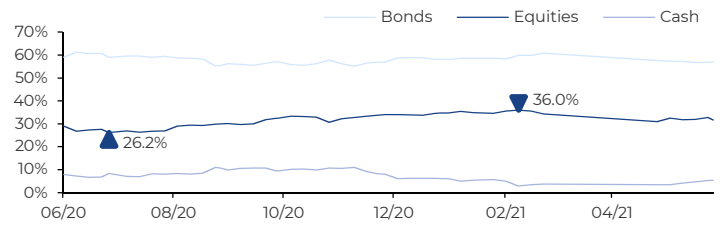

Asset class breakdown



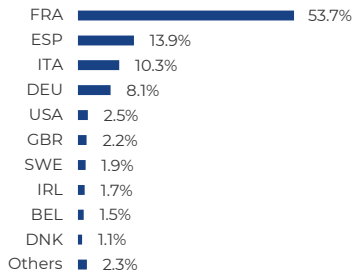

Real exposure per asset class over 1 year



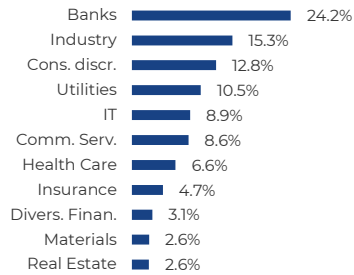

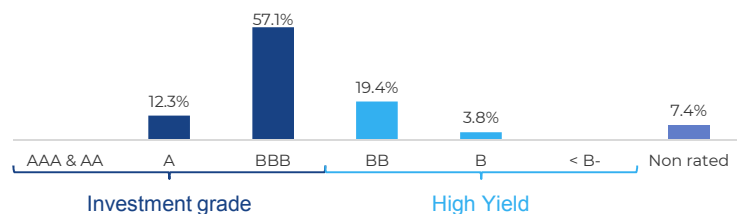

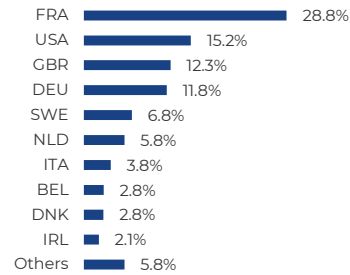

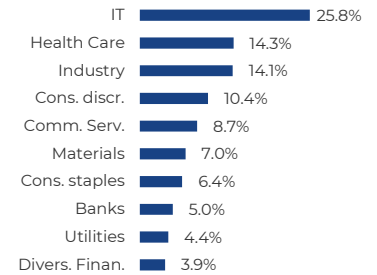
Equity Component

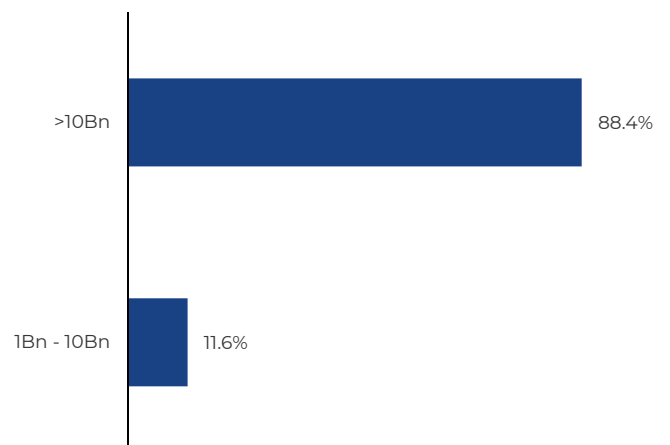

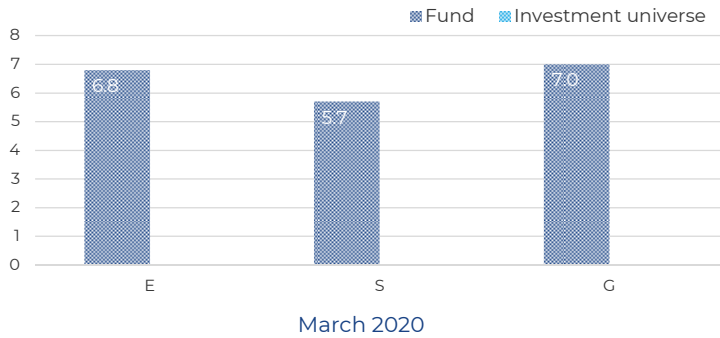

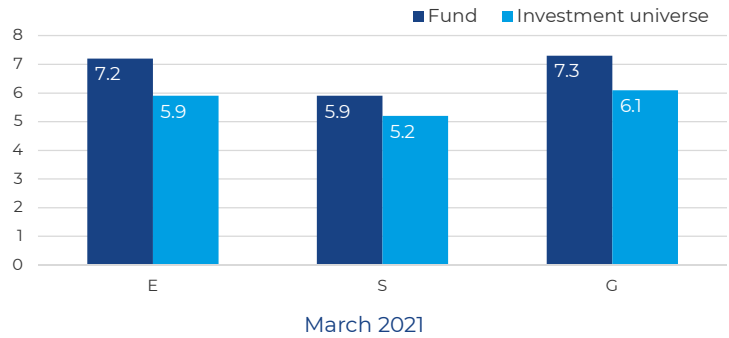
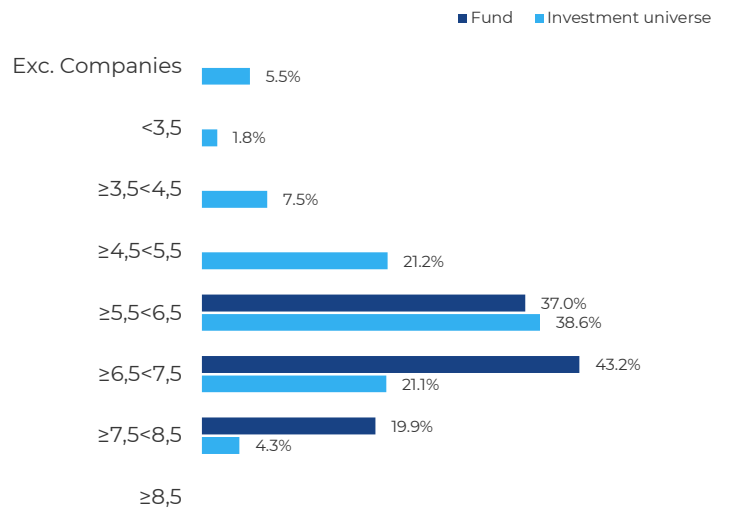

Average scores compared to the investment universe*

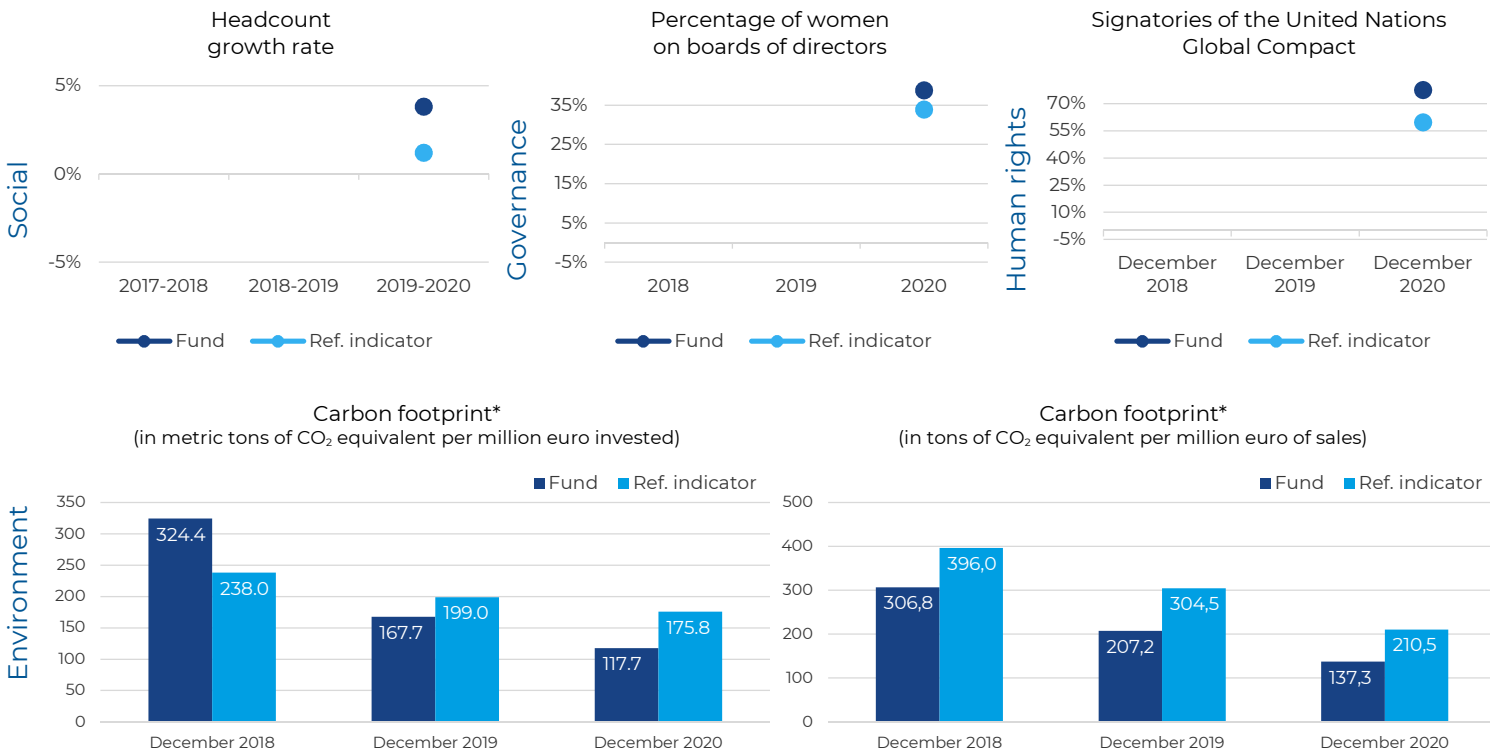


Distribution of ESG ratings of the fund and the investment universe*

Comment

We updated our ESG analysis of SAP, the leading German company in enterprise management software. Despite the departure in October 2019 of its charismatic CEO Bill McDERMOTT, which led to changes in management, the company's ESG rating has increased slightly to 7.1/10. After 17 years at SAP, including five as CEO, Bill McDERMOTT was replaced by Christian KLEIN, whose profile seems legitimate to us but who was appointed during an unprecedented period of change within the group's executive team. However, the corporate social responsibility measures taken by the company have raised its ESG score. The company has established ambitious environmental and social goals, including carbon neutrality by 2025 for its scope 1 and 2 emissions, as well as part of those under scope 3. It will also improve the representation of women in its management team by at least 30% by 2022. Furthermore, SAP's employer brand remains very strong and attracts many talented people.
