An Litir Bheag is a shortened and simplified version of Ruairidh's Litir do Luchd-ionnsachaidh (also available on the BBC website), designed for those who are at an earlier stage of learning Gaelic. The topic each week is the same as Litir do Luchd-ionnsachaidh so that, once the Litir Bheag is mastered, a student of the language might wish to try the full Litir. Tha beatach annasach eile a' fuireach air eileanan Loch Laomainn. Bha mi ag iarraidh am beatach sin fhaicinn. Dh'fhàg sinn Innis Caillich air a' bhàta is chaidh sinn gu eilean eile – Innis Chonachain. Coltach ri Innis Caillich tha e còmhdaichte le coille. Tha fraoch agus lusan dearc gu leòr ann fo na craobhan. Agus tha beatach annasach a' fuireach ann. Chan e dathas a tha ann, agus chan eil e bànn.

belongs to southern Europe; tha iad pailt ann an Sasainn agus sa Chuimrigh: they
are plentiful in England and Wales; thug na Ròmanaich a-steach iad, a rèir
choltais: the Romans introduced them, apparently; Raibeart Brus: Robert [the]
Bruce; bha am Brusach a' lorg àite airson dathais a shealg: [the] Bruce was
looking for a place to hunt fallow deer; freagarrach: suitable; saor bho
mhadaidhean-allaidh: free from wolves; breac ruadh: red-brown and
speckled/spotted; tha mòran dhiubh bànn, seach ruadh: many of them are fair
(white), rather than red-brown; beathach annasach eile: another unusual animal;
bha mi ag iarraidh am beathach sin fhaicinn: *I was wanting to see that animal;*
Innis Chonachain: *Inchconnachan; còmhdaichte le coille: covered by forest; tha*
fraoch agus lusan dearc gu leòr ann fo na craobhan: there is plenty of heather and
blaeberry below the trees; uachdaran: landowner; 's e ualabai beathach
Astràilianach coltach ri cangarù beag: *a wallaby is an Australian animal like a*
small kangaroo; fhuair cuid dhiubh ma sgaoil: some of them got loose; rugadh a'
bhean agam ann an Astràilia: *my wife was born in Australia; bha mi airson ualabai*
Albannach a shealltainn dhi: *I wanted to show her a Scottish wallaby; bha iad gan*
cumail fhèin am falach: *they were keeping themselves hidden; chan fhaca sinn gin:*
we didn't see any.
