Question 8 (a) (i)

A triangle in which the three sides have different lengths

Question 8 (a) (ii) A 7.2 8 60° 9

FORMULA: Enlargements

Scale factor
$$k = \frac{|\text{Image length}|}{|\text{Object length}|}$$
 $k^2 = \frac{|\text{Image area}|}{|\text{Object area}|}$

$$k = \frac{|\text{Image length}|}{|\text{Object length}|} = \frac{|CD|}{|AB|} = \frac{9}{7 \cdot 2} = 1 \cdot 25 \leftarrow \text{Triangle } CDE \text{ is the image of the object } ABC.$$

$$|ED| = k |BC| = 1.25(8) = 10 \text{ m}$$

 $|FG| = k |ED| = 1.25(10) = 12.5 \text{ m}$

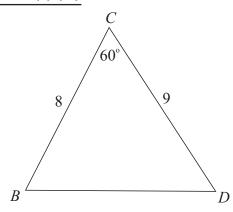
Question 8 (a) (i) [Scale 5B (0, 2, 5)]

- 2: Any work of merit such as any triangle drawn with no measurement of sides indicated or defines an isosceles triangle
- 5: A triangle drawn with three different lengths indicated

Question 8 (a) (ii) [Scale 15D* (0, 4, 7, 11, 15)]

- **4:** Any work of merit e.g. an indication that [FG] is an enlargement of [BC] or [ED] or work towards scale factor
- 7: Further work of merit such as scale factor found
- 11: An almost complete response such as scale factor applied to [BC] to get [ED] correctly or fails to finish e.g. leaves |FG| as $1 \cdot 25^2 \times 8$ or $1 \cdot 25 \times 10$
- 15: Correct answer without work shown

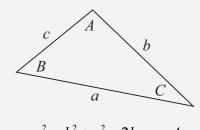
Question 8 (a) (iii)



$$|BD|^2 = 8^2 + 9^2 - 2(8)(9)\cos 60^\circ = 73$$

 $\therefore |BD| = \sqrt{73} = 8.544 \text{ m}$

$$a^2 = b^2 + c^2 - 2bc \cos A$$

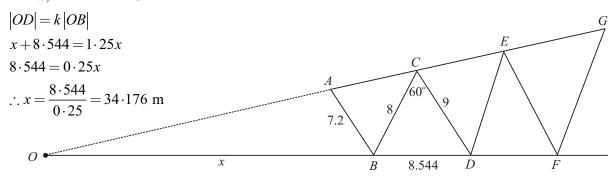

- 11: An almost complete response such as cosine rule worked to $\sqrt{73}$.
 - Correct answer without work shown

Question 8 (a) (iv)

If you work the lines AG and BF back they will meet at O, the centre of the enlargement. Triangle ODC is the image of triangle OBA.

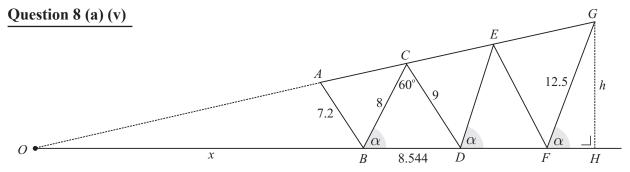
Call *x*, the distance *OB*.

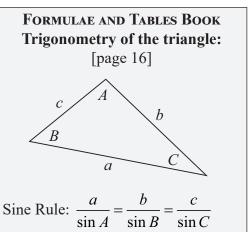
Question 8 (a) (iv) [Scale 5B* (0, 2, 5)]

- 2: Any work of merit such as an effort at finding or explaining the centre of enlargement or an effort at the use of the scale factor to find the centre of enlargement
 - Correct answer without work shown



Apply the Sine rule on triangle BCD to find $\sin \alpha$:

$$\frac{\sin \alpha}{9} = \frac{\sin 60^{\circ}}{8.544}$$
$$\sin \alpha = \frac{9\sin 60^{\circ}}{8.544}$$



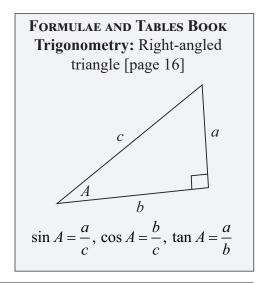
Triangle *GHF* is a right-angled triangle. Find $\sin \alpha$:

$$\sin A = \frac{\text{Opposite}}{\text{Hypotenuse}}$$

$$\sin \alpha = \frac{h}{12 \cdot 5}$$

$$\therefore \frac{9\sin 60^{\circ}}{8 \cdot 544} = \frac{h}{12 \cdot 5}$$
$$\therefore h = \frac{12 \cdot 5 \times 9\sin 60^{\circ}}{8 \cdot 544} = 11 \cdot 4 < 11 \cdot 6 \text{ m}$$

The plan meets the condition.

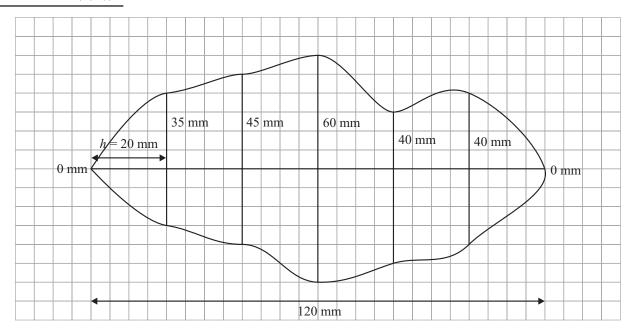

Question 8 (a) (v) [Scale 10D (0, 2, 5, 8, 10)]

- **2:** Any work of merit e.g. vertical height indicated (from point G or in triangles CBD, EDF) or correct relevant formula identified or |FG| = 12.5

- 5: Further work of merit such as α or $\sin \alpha$ found
- 8: An almost complete response whereby h is found but no conclusion is given

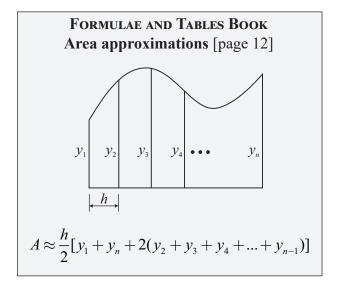
Question 8 (b) (ii)

$$h = 20 \text{ mm}$$

$$A = \frac{20}{2} [0 + 0 + 2(35 + 45 + 60 + 40 + 40)]$$

$$= 10[440]$$

$$= 4400 \text{ mm}^2$$

- 4: Any work of merit such as a correct substitution of h, F + L or OTHERS
 - Correct answer without work shown

 - One correct substitution followed by some correct calculation
- 11: An almost correct response such as fully correct substitution followed by an error in calculation
 - Two correct substitutions followed by fully correct calculation
