

LOCAL OUT OF SCHOOL CLUB

Some parents have expressed an interest in investigating the viability of an Out of School Club starting in the Spring/Summer of 2005, initially for children who attend Meppershall Lower School. The Club would aim to provide affordable, good quality childcare for parents seeking to obtain, or remain in, employment or further training, as well as providing an exciting social club. A programme of creative, safe and fun leisure opportunities would be provided, according to the age of the children attending. The Club would be registered with the Early Years Directorate, OFSTED.

The exact times and hours of opening will depend on stated need, but the Club would run on a fee-paying basis and would be open for two hours after school in term time. If there is sufficient demand for morning provision, the Club may seek to open at this time.

We will keep you informed as to the progress we are making via the Meppershall Messenger and the School.

Firstly, we send our get well greetings to Kath Milner and Min Tink who are both recovering from illnesses.

We had an inspiring Service and Sunday Club on 2nd May when, despite the Bank Holiday weekend, we had a good number of children in Sunday Club run by Becky Snelson, and helped by Roma Lester as well as adults in the congregation. We continued on an Easter theme and celebrated again the Resurrection of Jesus. We welcome the arrival of Rev. Harper and his family to Meppershall and wish him well as he begins his ministry in Meppershall and Shefford. Finally, we thank Ben Griffith, out going Churchwarden, for his help and enthusiasm in bringing together in Family Worship Methodists, Anglicans and, not least, the 1st Meppershall Brownies who led the service with Mr. Brian Bellamy and Ben himself, on Remembrance Sunday.

PENTECOST 30TH MAY

Last night I attended a dinner party with a difference. The difference was that all the guests were involved in a Murder Mystery role play to solve the murder of a Mr. Raymond Revue, a wealthy Night Club and Restaurant owner. I was cast as Lady Goodie Two Shoes, charity fund-raiser, but my other female friends were role playing a lap dancer and a socialite/model! It was all good fun, but our characters were developed to the point that I began to feel distinctly uneasy as Goodie, as I didn't much like her at all. All in all, the lap dancer was much the better person!

We all have perceptions of others, what they do, the parts that they play in real life, their character traits both good and bad, and their relationships within their families and outside them. The BBC are currently broadcasting a series of programmes entitled "Brassed Off Britain" focusing on which occupations we all love to hate. May God help you if you are an honest Estate Agent or a diligent bank employee, or a helpful, skilled

tradesman, because, according to the programme's perfunctory statistics, the public at large are baying for your blood - ad demanding compensation!

I don't need to tell you what a bad press the early Christians had, facing the Chief priests of the Jews, local governors and not least the populations subjugated to the Romans, who were still searching for a Roman-Conquering Messiah, rather than the man who gave His love and life to reconcile His people as the Son of God. After the Ascension of Jesus to heaven, the disciples became Messengers, called Apostles, bearing the good news of the Gospel in a hostile world. In order to empower them, to infuse them with the love of God, Jesus sent his Holy Spirit to comfort, inspire and equip them spiritually, at the time of Pentecost, to make new converts and to help them to share the dark days of their ministries. They met together, breaking bread and wine, to sustain them as they baptised, taught, healed, prayed and preached the love of God and forgiveness of sins. As martyrs, they proclaimed the Gospel of the Son of God, dying horrific deaths as witnesses to His truth. So what of Christians today? We need the Holy Spirit too, very badly, and it is not simply a matter of attending Church. As we make our spiritual life journey, the Holy Spirit we accept in Jesus' name is there to enable us to stand up for Jesus in every way we can, every day. We fight apathy, indifference, marginalisation, but we must offer patience, understanding, compassion, faith, hope and love in our lives if we aim to follow Jesus, and if we wish others to join us. These are huge expectations, and we are only human, with our share of faults and buck passing and criticisms. But the Holy Spirit is on call, 24/7 for you and me and Goodie Two Shoes.
