SOOTY'S GONE!! Please help.



Sooty, that loveable bear, has gone missing from the Post Office Counter.

Each actor would be given just their own lines and the final three words of the lines spoken before their part to give them a cue. THOUGHTS ON D DAY

Despite the fact I was born in 1947, I do appreciate what sacrifices were made. We live in a village with at least two people who saved the world. One was a pilot of, I believe, a Spitfire and the other worked in Dover on the Radar. I will not embarrass them, but they will know who they are. We should be grateful to them and all the others who gave so much.

EDWARD HARRIS'S STORY

Eddie Harris is a Meppershall man who now lives in Campton. He volunteered for Naval Service in 1942 aged 17 ½, but it was as a Naval Commando and gunner that he saw action on 6th June 1944. He landed on D Day and such was the chaos he and his comrades had to swim in, with full kit, as the Landing Craft had been targeted by enemy fire. By the time he arrived on Sword Beach he found a great deal of enemy resistance. His first task was to retrieve bodies of men who had died in the onslaught, picking up corpses turned yellow by immersion in the sea, and setting them apart from the able-bodied and leaving them to be blessed by the Padre, who was also giving solace to the dying.

Towards the evening, Eddie was entrenched on the beach firing at the German defences. Every third bullet was a tracer that gave away his position to the Germans. There was a German in the chapel above the cliffs, firing at the troops on Sword, picking off the men landing on the beach and those defending the beach, like Eddie, and successfully killing and wounding them, until the chapel was blown up by the British.

Eddie took a direct hit from one of the two German planes buzzing the beach, which shattered his kneecap and rendered the rest of his leg useless. By dragging his bad leg along the beach he managed to find shelter under the wreckage of a boat which afforded him some cover. He and his mate Ginger had become separated, but Eddie could hear Ginger calling for his mother. That was the last he heard of Ginger.

Fortunately a stretcher party found Eddie barely conscious and in horrific pain. So bad was his injury and the shock which had set in, that he cannot remember clearly quite what happened, but knows he was taken to a Hospital Ship called MAUWI from New Zealand. Later he was sent to no fewer than four hospitals in his bid to recover. At Portsmouth his knee was operated upon and he was transferred to Basingstoke. Then he was sent to Penarth in Wales, and finally to City Lodge Hospital Cardiff. His knee was never the same again and the injury has troubled him to this day.

In the meantime, Eddie's mother in Meppershall had received a telegram informing her that Eddie has died in the D Day landings, as so many did. Fortunately, this was rectified and his mother and sisters went down to Cardiff to see him, thrilled to know that he was alive.

Through long years he had told very little of his ordeal, as it is a nightmarish experience for him to recall D Day, but with extended coverage of the 60th anniversary, he has told his story again and the stories of those like Ginger, who Eddie never heard of again.

We owe Eddie a debt of gratitude that will be enshrined in history. Personally, he was not eager to have his story in print, but his wife Joyce and family feel that it is important to recognise what he did for his country and for the freedom from dictatorship we now enjoy. This is Eddie's story and we thank him and salute him for what he went through on our behalf.

Donna socialises puppies prior to their training, but Coco unfortunately has a health problem that makes her unsuitable for further training. Mrs. Whitehead explained the history of hearing dogs which was founded in America 22 years ago and built up in England from two people starting in their home. One in seven people suffer from hearing problems of varying degrees and many lives are transformed after acquiring a hearing dog, allowing them to regain their independence and confidence after leading very isolated lives. 75% of hearing dogs are rescue dogs and they have to be taught to respond to sign language and the specific sounds relating to the person and the home in which they will live.

Our speaker at the July meeting on Wednesday 14th will be Miss Doody on the subject of Well Dressing. Visitors and new members are always welcome.

Dear Friends,

My first month as Rector has flown by and it has been so good to meet many friendly faces and to discover a little more of this delightful corner of God's creation. Sandra and I thoroughly enjoyed meeting people from Shefford and Meppershall at our Open Day, and extend an invitation to others to call in to say hello whenever they wish (if you call in the evening ours is a wonderful spot for sunset watching!).

St. Mary's Gift Weekend is on Saturday and Sunday 3rd/4th July. This year we will be launching an appeal to ensure that our beautiful and ancient parish Church will continue to serve the people of Meppershall for many years to come. In spite of good fabric work achieved over recent years, we have been advised that very major restoration work will need to be tackled over the coming five years or so, and the consequent costs will be substantial. Naturally we will be seeking grant aid from various sources, but in the process we will need to assure potential donors that the local community is doing all it can to make its own contribution. Your donations at the Gift Weekend will all be directed to this cause, and will be very gratefully received. If you are a taxpayer, please add name and address so that St. Mary's can benefit by claiming back tax paid through the Gift Aid Scheme. Displays of the work we need to tackle will be on show over the weekend, as will some of our ancient possessions and registers.
