#### Mid Beds Introduces Alternate Week Waste Collection

From 4th October 2004 Mid Beds District Council will be collecting your waste a different way. Following the successful introduction of our RECYCLE NOW! Scheme our new contractor Verdant will collect your recyclable waste one week and your non-recyclable (residual) waste and next week.

Mid Beds is not alone in making this change to alternate week collections. Over 80 other authorities are operating alternative week collections or intend to do so, including many in this region. The switch will help cut the amount of waste going into landfill and control the increasing costs of waste disposal. Everyone now has the opportunity to use a green-lidded recycling bin for their paper, plastics and steel and aluminium cans. To get one, call 08452 304040.

We know this is a big change for people and we are asking everyone to be patient with the council and our contractors while the new scheme settles down. Verdant are working closely with id Beds to plan for the smooth introduction of this new alternate waste collection and recycling scheme.

We are implementing this scheme to encourage everyone to start taking responsibility for reducing the amount of waste we create. Every year household waste increases by 4% and if that trend continues the amount we throw away will double by 2020. We have to meet Government set targets for recycling - 12% now and 18% by 2005/2006. Mid Beds has also set its own target for recycling of 24% by 2005/2006. By moving to an alternative week collection system we hope to encourage more householders to recycle more and throw away less. The change will also mean that Mid Beds will save around £700,000 a year which helps reduce further increases in your council tax.

#### **HOW IT WORKS**

The alternate weekly waste collection scheme is very simple. One week you put out your green lidded wheeled bin for collection in the usual way. This bin should contain only recyclable waste newspapers, shredded paper, aluminium and steel cans, certain plastics. You can also recycle your garden waste in a white, biodegradable plastic sack. You can put out up to five each fortnight for recycling with your green-lidded bin. You can also take glass bottles and jars to one of our 60 bottle banks and clothes and bric-a-brac can be taken to charity shops, who are always pleased to receive these in good condition.

The next week you should put out your black wheelie bins for collection in the normal way. These should only contain non-recyclable (residual) waste like food, nappies, used tissues. You can double wrap food and nappies to help reduce smells. Please remember our contractor will only collect waste from your wheeled bin - extra plastic sacks left by the bin will not be collected.

We have produced a comprehensive list of Frequently Asked Questions which is available on our website www.midbeds.gov.uk/recycling or by calling 08452 304040.

To recap - the most important points are:

- The new system starts on 4th October 2004
- Only properly separated waste residual (black bin) or recyclable (green lidded bin) will be collected
- Help will be available to those householders that find the new system particularly difficult, e.g. the elderly or infirm, very large families and flat dwellers

- Extra residual waste in sacks or boxes will not be collected
- If you have not asked for a green lidded bin or garden waste sacks yet call 08452 304040.

I also want to say that I hope that the need for restoration doesn't overwhelm what we do as a Church in the near future. Essentially the Church, here and wherever, is the community of those drawn by the sheer grace of the God we see reflected in the face of Jesus. By virtue of our baptism we are called to be living stones; those who combine together to represent Christ's words and works in today's world. A Church building without the people, however beautiful it may be, is simply an empty shell, whereas the life of the community of faith focused in corporate worship ensures that the building serves its purpose to the full, namely to the glory of God and the work of His Kingdom.

Within the Church there are people with different gifts and diverse ways to being living stones. Some are called to full time ordained ministry, and I am delighted to tell you that Ben Griffith until recently Churchwarden here, has been recommended for training for ordination. I ask you to support him with your prayers, and I will be pleased to keep you informed of his progress. Ben has contributed greatly to the life of St. Mary's over the past few years, and his enthusiasm will be much missed, though in due course will surely be used for others' benefit.

In September there will be an opportunity to explore the meaning of confirmation (and/or adult baptism) and what's entailed in the preparation. If you would like to find out more you will be welcome at an enquiry session (no obligation) at the Rectory on Wednesday 15th September 6.30pm - 7.30pm for 10s to 16s, and 7.45pm - 8.45pm for 17s and over. Or just give me a ring to talk it over.

We will celebrate Harvest over the weekend of 9th and 10th October beginning with Friends of St. Mary's Festival of Music featuring the Woburn Sands Brass Band on Saturday 7.30pm buffet supper and wine included. 
