Petition for Alternate Week Waste Collection

The following reply has been received from Mrs. B. Morris, Head of Democratic and Legal Services, Mid Beds District Council:

"I now write to advise you that the petition received from residents of Meppershall. Shillington, Stondon and Gravenhurst relating to the alternate week waste collection scheme was submitted to the meeting of the Executive on 15th September 2004.

At that meeting the Executive agreed to the alternate week waste collection as previously agreed but, subject to approval of additional funding by the Council at its meeting on 28th October 2004, will be enhancing the scheme to provide compost buts free of charge on a first come, first served basis up to a maximum expenditure of £50 000, to take effect from February 2005. If the additional funding is approved, details of how to obtain a compost bin will be published in the January 2005 edition of the Council's Horizon magazine.

The Meppershall Baby and Toddler Group is a friendly, active group run by committed volunteers who are nominated and voted for by the parents themselves. 

MEPPERSHALL BROWNIES OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD 2004

In 2003 Meppershall Brownies and Meppershall residents co-operated in SAMARITAN'S PURSE PROJECT CHRISTMAS CHILD, where shoe boxes full of gifts were sent across Central and Eastern Europe to children in hospitals, refugee camps, orphanages, homeless shelters and poverty stricken neighbourhoods to children who would otherwise have no gifts at all. These gifts were given regardless of nationality, political background or religious beliefs. Samaritan's Purse is a Christian organisation and where appropriate offer booklets explaining the true meaning of Christmas in the gift boxes.

The Brownies would like it very much if you could donate gifts with which they would fill the boxes as, without your generous donations, they would not have sufficient funds to fill the boxes themselves. This is what Brown Owl and the Brownies would like you to do:

- 1. After checking the list below, choose a suitable gift for boys or girls in one of these categories, 2-4yrs, 5-9 yrs, 10-14 yrs. These gifts should be new or nearly new.
- Between 1st and 15th November, take your gift or gifts to Roger and Mary at the Bakery or Steve and Carolyn at the Village Stores.
 We are very grateful to the Bakery and Village Stores for their services as collection points for gifts.

Please select gifts only from the Yes List:

Cuddly toy
Toothbrush, toothpaste, soap flannel
Note pad, colouring book, picture books
Pens, pencils
Crayon or felt pen set
A hat, cap, gloves, scarf
Small ball or tennis ball
Puzzle e.g. small jigsaw
For boys, toy truck, car or aeroplane
For girls, clip earrings, makeup or hair accessories
Greetings card or photo of yourself
Sweets well within sell by date

Please do not donate gifts from No List. It will take extra time to exclude them and less time for filling boxes:

Chocolate
Other edible food
War related items e.g. guns, soldiers, knives
Clothing (except as listed above)
Glass containers, mirrors or fragile items
Liquids of any type (aerosols, shampoo, bubble bath, blow bubbles)
Marbles or sharp objects
Nothing of a political, racial or religious nature
Medicines
Books with words.

These lists may seem daunting, but careful selection means that more boxes can be filled. Please do not take boxes to the shops. The Brownies will provide boxes and will decorate them. The boxes will be filled under the guidance of Brown Owl (Mrs. Christine Elbourne) and adult helpers.

The timing is very sensitive this year as the boxes have to be sent by late November. The critical dates for taking gifts to the shops is between 1st and 15th November, or before if you are already aware of this collection.

If you have little time to spare, but want to be involved, please get in touch with Brown Owl on 811964 as for every box sent a fee of £2 is required for transport, promotion, processing and distribution and a monetary donation would be gratefully received.


