

#### SETTING SAIL FOR SOME 2012 OLYMPIC GLORY

A young sailor who is being groomed for Olympic glory in 2012 is appealing for support to help him realise his dream.

Meppershall resident Justin Martin, 18, is one half of Catamaran Team Volitio which is receiving specialist coaching for the 2008 and 2012 Olympics. A year ago Justin was sailing for Great Britain and going to the Europeans. "In the summer during the Olympics, the guys who were sailing the Tornado were not doing very well, and I got an e-mail asking me if I would like to take part in a new Olympic Catamaran programme."

Justin and his team-mate Kevin Cooper also 18 from Hertfordshire, generally attend the training camps at Weymouth and Portland Sailing Academy monthly using their 18 ft Hobie Tiger Catamaran. The February camp has been extended to eight days over the half term. "It's called the Olympic Development Squad. The RYA have invited four potential teams, eight people that have been sailing at a fairly high standard, and shown that they can already sail well and proved themselves at different events." "The aim is to train together and get the best out of all of us and get the best team for the Olympics."

Each of the four teams is competing to represent Great Britain at the Beijing Olympics in 2008 but because Team Volitio is the youngest team involved, the following 2012 Olympics is more likely to be its chance for glory and their aim is to win gold. "At training camps we also get to meeting past Olympic sailors coming to train. It is inspiring and gives us something to aim for."

Dear Friends,

Hanging on our lounge wall is a painted china plate that depicts my favourite Easter story. Three men are walking along a country road, chatting as they go, one bearing a shepherd's crook. The scene is not obviously from the bible, as the characters and the landscape are typically Chinese. I bought the plate at a Hong Kong monastery many years ago. But the story it portrays lies at the very heart of the Christian message. It shows Cleopas, a follower of Jesus and an unnamed companion on the road from Jerusalem to Emmaus, a journey of some seven miles. accompanied by the Risen Jesus, but they fail to recognise him. The story explains (St. Luke 24 v.13-35) that Jesus enquires of them what they are discussing, and they share their anguish at the events of the previous Friday. No doubt he could have dumbfounded them by making his resurrected presence beyond dispute - "Here I am risen from the grave". But what he actually says and does goes far deeper. First he asks questions to help them express their bewilderment. Then he explains how it is that all their trauma of the previous days fits with what had been prophesied in Scripture, if they have eyes to see it. And Jesus is prepared to leave it there - he isn't going to pres them if they aren't ready for more. But the two disciples do want more, and as they ask him to stay with them as they reach Emmaus, he reveals his true identity in the action of the breaking of bread. My Chinese plate says to me that the Jesus of Easter - the Jesus who cared for his mother and forgave the thief as he hung on the Cross, is the same Lord who deals gently with us according to who we are. He speaks to each of us according to our needs, our temperament and our understanding. He respects us for who we are, and is always more ready to lead us into the truth, as and when we are ready. The glory of every Easter is all about God's graciousness to his people - the way he walks alongside us and travels at our pace. It points us too to the way in which the Christian family, the Easter people, are to each out to others, all those for whom Jesus died and was raised in triumph.

With every good wish for a joyful Easter.

#### Hot Cross Muffin Buns

450g/1lb strong white bread flour
fig tsp salt
50g/2oz butter, cut into pieces
7g sachet easy-blend dried yeast
2 tsp ground mixed spice
50g/2oz golden caster sugar
Finely grated zest 1 lemon
275ml/9fl oz milk, plus extra to glaze
2 eggs beaten


200g/80z luxury mixed dried fruit, cherries halved For the Crosses and Glaze: 2 tbsp plain flour and golden syrup

Put all dough ingredients, except dried fruit, together and make dough. Once ready, turn out onto a lightly floured surface and punch down. Pan into large flat circle, tip the fruit in the centre and enclose with the dough. Knead the fruit in, cutting through the mixture with a sharp knife, then re-knead a few times to distribute the fruit evenly.

Cut out nine 14cm squares of baking parchment and have ready a 12 hole muffin tin. Cut the dough into 9 even sized pieces and roll each into a smooth ball. Push a square of the parchment into a tin hole and drop in a ball of dough. Repeat with the rest. Cover the tin loosely with lightly-oiled cling film and leave in a warm place for 30-45 minutes or until doubled in size. Preheat oven to fan 180C/conventional 200C/gas 6.

For the crosses, blend the flour to a smooth paste with 5-6 tsp of cold water. Spoon into a small plastic food bag and cut a small hole off one comer or use a piping bag. Pipe crosses on the buns. Bake for 15 minutes or until golden. Lift onto a cooling rack. Brush with a little golden syrup while warm.
