Antisocial Behaviour Relating to Vehicle Nuisance

There is a rash of activity involving off-road motorcycles, powered scooters and quad bikes in the area, particularly on and around the Bovis Estate and adjoining fields. In some cases is seems that parents are actually taking their children to these areas to ride. If the police bother to turn up, the persons reporting the matter have already been subjected to abuse from the riders who then proceed to speed off across nearby roads and pathways, causing a danger to themselves and others. None of the riders are wearing safety helmets! This sort of behaviour could be dealt with under Antisocial Behaviour guidelines. If you aggravate others, bear in mind that the law now enables the authorities to take action against you. Petrol driven mini scooters sometimes described as "Go Peds" and quad bikes are being used on public roads, bridle paths and fields under seed. These vehicles are regarded as motor vehicles as defined in the Road Traffic Act 1988. They need:

European Whole Vehicle Type approval To be registered with the DVLA Road Tax Number plate/s Break Lights Indicators

The age limit for someone to use such a vehicle is the same as for a moped. They must have a valid driving licence and the vehicle must not be driven on a public path. Riders must comply with the Highway Code and all relevant driving legislation. They also have to wear a proper motorcycle helmet.

Be warned! If you are caught riding a vehicle illegally you could be prosecuted. The worst scenario is that someone could be seriously hurt or killed. We are sure that this is the last thing that any parent or relative would want to happen. So take action now before it is too late!

A Plea for Help from the Parish Council

The Parish Council is seeking help with two projects that are about to be undertaken; namely the production of a Parish Plan and What To Do With The Village Hall.

About ten years ago a Village Appraisal was undertaken with Ron Mitchell leading the project. The appraisal took the form of a questionnaire developed by Ron and a small band of Parishioners from various groups, organisations and individuals and it was distributed to all households with numerous questions on most aspects of village life. The end report was used, where possible, to guide the direction the Village went in. The original guidelines for appraisal did not allow for Planning to be included.

The Parish Plan follows the same format but this time Planning can be included. So to develop the questions to be put to the Parishioners a working party of up to eight people is required. The Parish Council will be represented on working party and will arrange the necessary finance for the project but the Council would like it to be a Village run project so volunteers are required. It is thought the project will take just under a year to complete with most of the work at the beginning with working what questions should be asked and how they should be worded. So if you think you can help please contact me by one of the methods below.

In last months Messenger Paul Carne, Chairman of the Village Hall Management Committee, wrote about the condition the Village Hall is in and what should be done about it. It is obviously going to be topic for the questionnaire mentioned above but the Parish Council would like to have investigated as many of the alternatives for the hall as possible so that decisions can be as soon as the results are known. To this end I am asking if anyone with a knowledge of business or the ways of local government or maybe have been involved with major fund raising, possible just retired or just wants to get involved please contact me by one of the following methods to obtain more information. Even if you do not you fall into any of those groups but still want to help, please, get in touch.

I personally believe that a Village Hall is a necessary part of any Village and would hate to lose the facility.

Beds is split into three sections each with differences in collecting methods. 200,000 tons were collected in 2003/4 with targets of 4% increase each year. There is a great need to recycle as we are running out of landfill sites and we need to reduce the demand for raw materials. When everything has been sorted (plastic, tins, paper and card) and packaged it is sent to various destinations throughout the country, some to be made into other materials such as fleece, etc. One of the uses of recycled glass is as aggregate for road building. A very informative talk followed by many questions from our audience.

Our next meeting is on 11th May followed by a beetle drive.

Dear friends,

Just before the last General Election I was encouraged to witness a debate involving three M.P.s from different parties, all of whom had more in common than their contrasting allegiances might have suggested. Their plea was not for a particular vote, but that Christian people should let their voices be heard, both in the political arena and in the whole context of building a just community for Britain. The M.P.s were practising Christians, and they recognised that when the Christian community prays and speaks with a united voice, God honours their requests, and things happen that show the marks of His Kingdom.

When Election Day arrives this time we have another opportunity of using our hard won democratic rights to contribute to a society where the things of God are honoured. Maybe its sheer coincidence, but May 5 is Ascension Day, - the day when Christians give thanks for the sovreignty of Christ at the completion of his earthly ministry. The challenge of the election is to use our vote in such a way that this God we see in Jesus is shown to 'reign' in our nation's life and values. That may represent a costly decision, because it may well conflict with the choice that would best advance our personal interests. And yet we have the assurance that if we 'seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, all these things shall be added unto you'. And that applies not only at election time, but whenever we have the chance to stand up for what honours God and his ways - his truth, his compassion his justice. Ascension Day can be a single opportunity to 'Make the Cross count', but every single day is a chance to demonstrate whose authority really matters.
