

Dear Editor....

This week, three bags of household waste were left on our driveway when our bin was "emptied". This was the straw that broke the camel's back following months of frustration with a scheme that was introduced in the winter of 2004, which has resulted in Mid Beds residents smelling rotting rubbish outside their doors and windows. Fortnightly collection of recyclable waste should not necessarily mean that domestic rubbish should be treated in the same way. This policy has been instigated without knowing the implications for public and environmental health.

Our bin cannot contain the domestic waste a family of four produce over fourteen days. Mid Beds Council contractors are only allowed to empty one bin of domestic waste once per fortnight. If the lid is not down and the bin is too full, it will not be emptied. What about the health and safety of the residents of our area? Beds on Sunday have reported that there have been maggots and rats, as a result of this policy. How does it help the environment if I am driving rubbish to the nearest tip?

Surprisingly there have not been enough complaints for Local Councillors to take note. We would urge all those who have concerns use local democracy to effect change and contact Mid Beds District Council (08452 304040). We would also encourage individuals to talk to their District and County Councillors and alert our MP to encourage them to reconsider the frequency of domestic waste collection.

Observations

Following on from last months progress report, a number of people have made observations concerning the haste with which the electrical installation was carried out. All I can do is agree with you.

If time were on our side we would have planned exactly what fittings were required. We would have consulted with all the groups to see whether they wanted to add anything into the works. We would have given the electricians proper notice, so that we knew exactly when they would be in. We would have ensured that groups had plenty of notice so that they could make appropriate plans. And we would not have taken bookings for that period.

However, we did not have time. From a safety standpoint, I would have had no option but to close the hall. In addition, we needed to arrange for a safety certificate to be produced for our licence renewal, which was imminent.

It came to this position because previous committees were focussed on obtaining funds for a new hall and therefore did not want to commit funds into renovating a hall that was due for replacement. This is understandable. However, it meant we had to act immediately.

I hope that answers some questions that some of you may have had.

The Great North Run

We all arrived in Newcastle early Sunday morning. We quickly made our way to the start line where we had to change. We all looked the part in our running gear with our bright orange Colon Cancer Concern running vests. The morning started cloudy but it soon warmed up. We had to wait for about two hours before the start – lining up along markers estimating how long it would take to run the race. Matthew and Peter, being young and fit, decided to move to the front while the more sensible amongst us stayed about 100 metres from the start line. It was amazing to be in a crowd of over 55,000 runners waiting to go. Everyone was so friendly and supportive of us 'new boys!' The female athletes and the wheelchair races started first and then it was the turn of the male athletes and the 'ordinary' runners.

The atmosphere was electric and we all got a good sending off by various celebrities at the start. Crossing the Tyne Bridge was a very moving experience – a sea of bodies all running towards Gateshead. The weather had warmed up considerably and the first water station was four and a half miles into the run. Luckily we came prepared and all had a drink to carry with us. Running soon became difficult as so many people were already walking – we wanted to try to run the whole 13 miles – so dodging large numbers of bodies became the order of the day. When we got to the eight mile water station they had run out of water! Runners were scrambling around the floor looking for discarded bottles with any water still remaining. There were thankfully several helpful spectators with

hosepipes at the ready to help us keep cool.

All around the course there were live bands to entertain us – when we passed them, everyone started to run in time with the music! The local support was fantastic – lots of encouragement and 'Geordie' humour

After about five miles, Anna and I had lost contact with the rest of the team. We got to ten miles within our target time of 2 hours thinking we were almost there – how wrong! The last three miles were long and painful but we made it to the finish still together. We crossed the line exhausted but elated. We had run the whole 13 miles without stopping once and felt very proud yet humble. There were so many runners supporting so many good causes. We saw parents running while pushing their children in wheelchairs – 13 miles! We saw people with messages on their shirts saying things like 'I'm running in memory of my Dad'. Would we do it again – you bet! We have already pre-registered – and the year after, maybe the London Marathon!!!

Everyone has been so generous sponsoring our team. We have been promised well over £2000 and money is coming in fast. A very BIG thank you to everyone who has supported us.
