

## Village Plan – RAVE Bus & Open Days

In developing the Village Plan it is necessary to consult with as many sections of village people as possible. As part of this process the Steering Group, assisted by members of the BRCC (Bedfordshire Rural Communities Charity), organized two events aimed at different groups. Both were an outstanding success.

The RAVE Bus is a travelling youth centre aimed at 13 to 18 year olds. This bus visited Meppershall on the evening of the 21<sup>st</sup> September and during the evening approximately 14 young people attended and gave their views on the issues facing Meppershall.

Yes the young people want more facilities aimed at their age group – football pitch, youth club & youth facilities, discos, the RAVE bus to call again etc, but they also want improved social conditions, they are concerned about drugs (use & dealing) and want better bus services and improved health clinic.

On the 22<sup>nd</sup> & 23<sup>rd</sup> September there were Open Days held in the Methodist Hall. At this event everyone was encouraged to come and have their say on the future, problems and good things about our village. Approximately 186 people of varying ages, from all parts of the village, new villagers and those who were born here called in. (We had hoped for between 50 and 100 visitors, so the Steering Group were extremely pleased with the attendance).

Not only was the attendance high, but all came with their own views on the future of Meppershall. Using "The Planning For Real" system loaned by the RCC everyone was able to identify what they wanted or didn't want to happen to Meppershall. Over 1500 items of data have been collected as the result of this activity.

Please remember this is not the village plan, just information leading towards it. However we presented some of the early findings, first to the Steering Group and then to the Parish Council.

Two issues stood out (neither are a surprise)

- 1. A large number want something done about the traffic in the village. Too fast, too much, parking poor, pavements inadequate and so on. The Parish Council are awaiting a whole village traffic survey to be carried out and this information will be very useful in helping them get that done. Once that is done then it is possible to see what measures can or can't be taken.
- 2. Again no surprise development / housing. This varied from NO more development, to needing family houses, sheltered accommodation, homes for the young and for the elderly. Overall it looks like the right type of development, development in line with the village character is needed rather than none at all.

The information gathered at these events and other consultations will enable a number of things.

- It will help the Steering Group to look at the questionnaire they are preparing and ensure it is as relevant as possible.
- Later, when it comes to analysing the questionnaires the team will not just have the data from the answers, but more information that will enable a fuller appreciation of the results.
- Provide immediate feedback to interested parties

Our thanks to all who gave up a few minutes of their time to meet the team, it was great to see so many villagers voting with their feet and showing that the people of Meppershall care about what happens to their village.

## Meppershall Parish Council Report

Your Parish Council met on 4<sup>th</sup> October to discuss a number of items some of which I have highlighted below: -

## **Planning & Housing**

The full council discussed three planning applications. On two, objections were raised and the final application was returned for clarification that the proposed dwelling was within the building envelope. The councils' objections and comments are sent to the planning authority, Mid Beds District Council, where a Planning Officer or the Planning Committee have the final say after taking into account individual representations and Parish Council comments.

## Highways & Lighting

Although the Council was pleased with the amount of resurfacing recently carried out they will still express their concern to the County Highways department about the condition of Rectory Road which is seen as a priority.

Parking on the pavements and verges was also discussed because of obstruction and danger caused to pedestrians and the potential damage caused to the utility services below ground. It was pointed out that obstructing the pavement is an offence and vehicles should be reported to the Police for action

#### **Environment & Leisure**

A gate has been ordered to prevent unauthorised traffic from using the access path behind Crackle Hill.

New play equipment for the young children's play area has been ordered and will be installed as soon as possible. This will complete the current project of renewing and enhancing the young peoples play areas. Old Road Meadow has been sprayed for ragwort again which hopefully will see the end of the problem. Work has started on controlling the hedgerows and two replacement trees will be planted in the autumn.

## Meppershall Parish Plan

Following a highly successful consultation weekend the working group Chairman reported the initial findings to the Council. It is evident that road safety and speeding traffic concerned a majority of those who visited the exhibition. With these statistics the Clerk will again stress to the Highways Department that traffic survey requested early this year by the Council is a very high priority and we have waited long enough. The survey is a requirement before we can commence on traffic calming measures.

Finally I would like to take this opportunity to remind you that all Council meetings are open to the public. The last meeting was attended by seven members of the public and all your District and County Councillors who report to every meeting about District and County matters. In every agenda there is always an opportunity for any member of the public to address or question the Council on any matter they wish.
