### Village Plan

If everything has gone to plan, along with this Messenger you should also receive a copy of the questionnaire that will form a major part of the data that will result in the Meppershall Village Plan.

Over the last ten months the Meppershall Plan Steering Group have met with various organizations, consulted with our neighbouring councils, and with the aid of people from the Rural Communities Charity organized Open Days and Green Walks. All of this has been recorded and will be used later.

Now we need your help. The questionnaire will give us a wide view of what the village wants, not what we think the village wants. We appreciate that it is a fairly large document, but the more questionnaires we get back, the more weight we can put on the findings when we come to the "plan" part of the exercise.

There may be some questions that you have no opinion on, then please leave them blank, or questions that you feel are personal to you, this we understand, but please note that we have no idea who is filling in the document, however we understand if you leave out those questions. Same applies to questions you think are not applicable to yourself (but still might be applicable to someone else in the household).

To put an "Other answer" box for each person at each question would have made the whole document several pages longer. If you have a different answer then please use one of the boxes on the last page, or simply write your answer near the question (please make sure we know which person is answering). If you still need more room for your replies, then please just write your information on the back of the document.

All data is anonymous.

If you have any problems understanding what is being asked, need assistance, need a larger print copy, then please call one of the team, their numbers are on the last page of the questionnaire

Once we have the questionnaires back we will be entering them into a computer and from that we will get the answers of how many answered a question one way or another. This is the beginning of some very important phases of the process.

A draw number has been put on the bottom of the front sheet and on a tear off strip. All returned copies of the questionnaire will be entered in a draw for a bottle of champagne, so tear off strip when you return your copy. (The numbers are not recorded anywhere and we have no idea which copies are delivered to where). We will publish the winning number in the July/August Messenger for the person to claim their prize.

Our thanks to those who took part in the piloting of the questionnaire, we may not have used all your input, but we did review all inputs received, again thank you.

We have decided to use the same method of delivery and collection as used by some door to door companies. When you have completed your questionnaire, if you put it outside your door, between the 14<sup>th</sup> & 21<sup>st</sup> May, then one of the collection team will pick it up. Alternately you can drop it off at one of the team members or give them a call to arrange its collection from you.

The more returns we get, the clearer picture of the feelings, wants and needs of Meppershall villagers can be drawn, so please, please can you take a little time and complete the questionnaire.

## Meppershall Parish Council Report

#### Planning & Housing

This month there was only one application, this was recommended for approval.

#### Highways & Lighting

The results of the recent traffic survey were presented to the meeting, which showed the following average weekly statistics for traffic exceeding the 30 MPH

Speed Limit: -

Shefford Road Northbound (towards Shefford) 209 vehicles per week exceeded 40 mph

18 vehicles per week exceeded 50 mph

Shefford Road Southbound (towards Shillington)

52 vehicles per week exceeded 40 mph 2 vehicles per week exceeded 50 mph

**High Street Northbound (towards Shefford)** 

7 vehicles per week exceeded 40 mph

1 vehicle per week exceeded 50 mph

High Street Southbound (towards Shillington) 9 vehicles per week exceeded 40 mph

0 vehicle was exceeding 50 mph

The traffic calming measures will be discussed with the Highways Dept as soon as

possible and we will keep you informed of progress. Our local Beat Manager PC Steve Busby informs us that armed with this data the Police know when and where

to target their speed checks. These figures cannot all be blamed on traffic passing through Meppershall. The

Council asked that the residents of Meppershall be aware of their speed and keep within the speed limit. Thankfully we have not had a serious accident in Meppershall but the evidence points to the possibility of a speed related incident in the near future.

### Police Community Support Officer (PCSO)

The Council agreed to contact neighbouring Parish Councils with a view to sharing a PCSO as it was felt that the village would benefit from a dedicated officer but not on a full time basis.



#### Moonshine

A rich version of a traditional bread and butter pudding

20z butter, softened
6 thin slices white bread (crusts removed)
20z sultanas 20z caster sugar
3 eggs, beaten
34 pint milk 44 pint single cream
Grated rind of half a lemon
Freshly ground nutmeg

Set oven to 350 F or Mark 4. Use a little of the butter to grease a shallow ovenproof dish and use the rest to butter the bread generously. Cut the bread into strips and arrange in the dish in layers, buttered side up, sprinkled with sultanas and sugar, finishing with a layer of buttered bread. Beat the eggs in a bowl. Heat the milk and cream in a pan to just below boiling point and stir into the eggs; add the lemon rind. Pour over the bread, sprinkle with nutmeg and leave to stand for 20 minutes for the bread to get well soaked. Bake for 30 to 40 minutes until the custard is set and the top is crisp and golden.
