Having had an article printed in the May edition of the Messenger, there is no stopping me now! Thankfully there has been no repetition of the motorbike saga – perhaps the growth of the crops has made that pursuit hazardous?

What brings me to write this time is the article by Mick Trundle. I believe it highlights an issue which everyone in the village needs to make an effort towards. I'm not talking about the vandalism to the electric fence, although I hope the perpetrators have had good the sense to return the item albeit anonymously. What I'm referring to is the subject of "newcomers" to the village. Being one myself it saddens me that the finger of suspicion always points at us as a "Group" whenever there is any trouble or issues in the village. I can understand how a traditional village where everyone knows everyone might view an influx of new residents with caution, especially when it increases the village population by 15-20% at a stroke. After all, you know nothing about us or our backgrounds, but similarly we know nothing about you either.

It sometimes feels like we're a community within a community and that assimilation will take a very long time. When we arrived I hoped the village pub would be a natural meeting place where we could get to know about the village and its people but, after one very uncomfortable drink in there, I haven't been back since! We want to become and be accepted as part of the village, as I'm sure all new residents do, but the village also needs to open up to assimilate "newcomers" more quickly as well. I'm sure the new residents bring skills and experience which could benefit the village as a whole if only there were a forum to find out.

The topic of new residents is not going to go away; if anything it's going to increase as John Prescott continues to concrete over the South East. Even as I write, the new estate of Lyspitt Common just off Fildyke Road is going to bring another batch of new residents to Meppershall, and so it will continue. That is why we all need to make an effort to find out about each other, then we can all pull together as a community instead of several communities co-existing within the same boundary. Only then will people feel confident enough to open their gardens, etc. For what it's worth, people are welcome to visit mine, although prepare to be disappointed!

#### Police Issue Warning on Burglaries

BEDFORDSHIRE Police are again reminding householders to ensure UPVC doors are properly locked at night following a series of burglaries or attempted burglaries in Mid and South Beds.

Police say over the last few days they have dealt with incidents at locations including Shefford, Meppershall, Upper Gravenhurst, Harlington, Studham Dunstable and Flitwick

Stolen have been items that are easily to hand such as handbags, lap-top computers, wallets and mobile telephones.

Police stress UPVC doors are safe, but householders must ensure they are double locked at night or when they go out. To do this property owners need to lift up the handle and turn and remove the key, which ensures the top and bottom bolts are in place and the whole unit is properly deadlocked.

The bolts protrude into the frame much further than the central catch and are particularly important on doors adjacent to a glazed side panel.

## Meppershall Parish Council Report

May is the month which is the commencement of a new Council year and a new four year term for your Councillors. I would like to welcome three new members to the Parish Council, Mike Castle, Phil Collins and Tony Sykes. I would like to thank you on behalf of the Village for volunteering to serve on the Council. I would also like to express my thanks to two retiring Councillors who have worked very hard for the Council during their appointment, Beverley Aberdein and Andy Williams.

As you may know the day to day work of the Council is divided into Working Groups, each of which has an experienced Councillor to lead it. I have been reelected as Chairman for the next year and below are details of all the groups and their responsibilities:-

## Planning & Housing – Spokesman – Peter Crossley

The Group reviews all Planning applications within the 21 day time-frame allowed. Their comments are fed back to the Parish Council and Mid Beds District Council who are responsible for the final decision. This month four applications were discussed with no objections.

#### Finance – Spokesman – John Parsons

The Finance Group is responsible for overseeing the Finances of the Council and the preparation of the annual budget and recommendations for the Precept. This year it is the same as 2006/7 at £28,000. At this meeting the Council approved the accounts for last year which now go forward for external auditing.

## Highways & Lighting - Spokesman - Roger Bryant

Roger spends a lot of his time chasing the Highways Department to ensure they do not forget us when it comes to potholes, broken or blocked drains, resurfacing, street lights not working etc. We can all help him by reporting directly to the Highways Help Line phone number (01234 228661). Do not forget to ask for a reference number, and if you wish, request feedback. Work on traffic calming is continuing as quickly as possible.

#### Environment & Leisure - Spokesman - Paul Merryweather

Responsible for all outside spaces, this can be the busiest Group of the Council. They are dedicated to improving our Environment, Play Areas and Open Spaces. At present some of their projects include lighting for the MUGA, Old Road Meadow management and improvements to play areas and equipment.

# Health & Safety and Risk Management - Spokesman - Peter Chapman.

This newly formed group is self explanatory and has yet to meet for the first time. Their first task will be to review and action the report from annual safety inspection report which will be undertaken by ROSPA in the next few weeks.

## MUESLI FRUIT & NUT BARS


100g/4oz butter
100g/4oz light muscovado sugar
4 tbsp golden syrup
100g pack pecan nuts
350g/12oz unsweetened muesli
1 medium ripe banana, mashed

Heat oven to 180c/fan 160C/gas 4. Butter and line the base of an 18 x 28cm tin with baking parchment. Melt the butter, sugar and syrup in a medium pan on a low heat, stirring until the sugar has dissolved. Cool slightly.

Chop half the nuts. Tip the muesli, banana and chopped nuts into the pan and stir until well mixed. Put into the tin and press down firmly with the back of a spoon.

Press whole nuts lightly into mixture. Bake for 20-25 mins until dark golden and edges are just crisp. Leave in tin until cold, then loosen edges with a knife. Cut into 12 slices. (Will keep in an airtight container for up to 5 days).
