This was Ray Charles' debut single. It also appeared on his debut album. The album is often referred to by a number of names: *Ray Charles*, *Rock n Roll* or *Hallelujah I Love Her So*. Charles is famed for being a pioneer of Soul music: combining Blues, Jazz and Gospel when he was signed to Atlantic Records. The label gained a reputation as one of the most important recording labels to specialize in Jazz, R&B and Soul by African American musicians.

Ray Charles became blind at the age of seven. He learnt to play piano at school, using braille. It is not an easy process: students play the left hand whilst feeling the part with their right hand, they then play the right hand whilst feeling the braille with their left hand. They then have to memorise the parts in order to put them together. Although he was taught to play classical music including Bach, Mozart and Beethoven he much preferred playing Jazz and Blues. He learnt his craft playing shows locally and at his school.


Ray Charles states that four great Jazz piano players influenced him: Art Tatum, Bud Powell, Nat "King" Cole and Oscar Peterson. In his early career, his style tended to imitate his idol Nat "King" Cole. Yet he began to develop his own style and released the song 'I Got A Woman' in 1955, which reached No. 1 on the R&B Chart. He later became known by the nickname "The Genius" due to his ability to blend music from a variety of genres and following his successful Soul




releases on Atlantic, moved into Country music also. Frank Sinatra referred to him as "the only true genius in show business".

Throughout his career he was awarded a total of 12 Grammy Awards. He holds the record for the most posthumous awards won in one night at the 2005 Grammys where he was awarded five.


