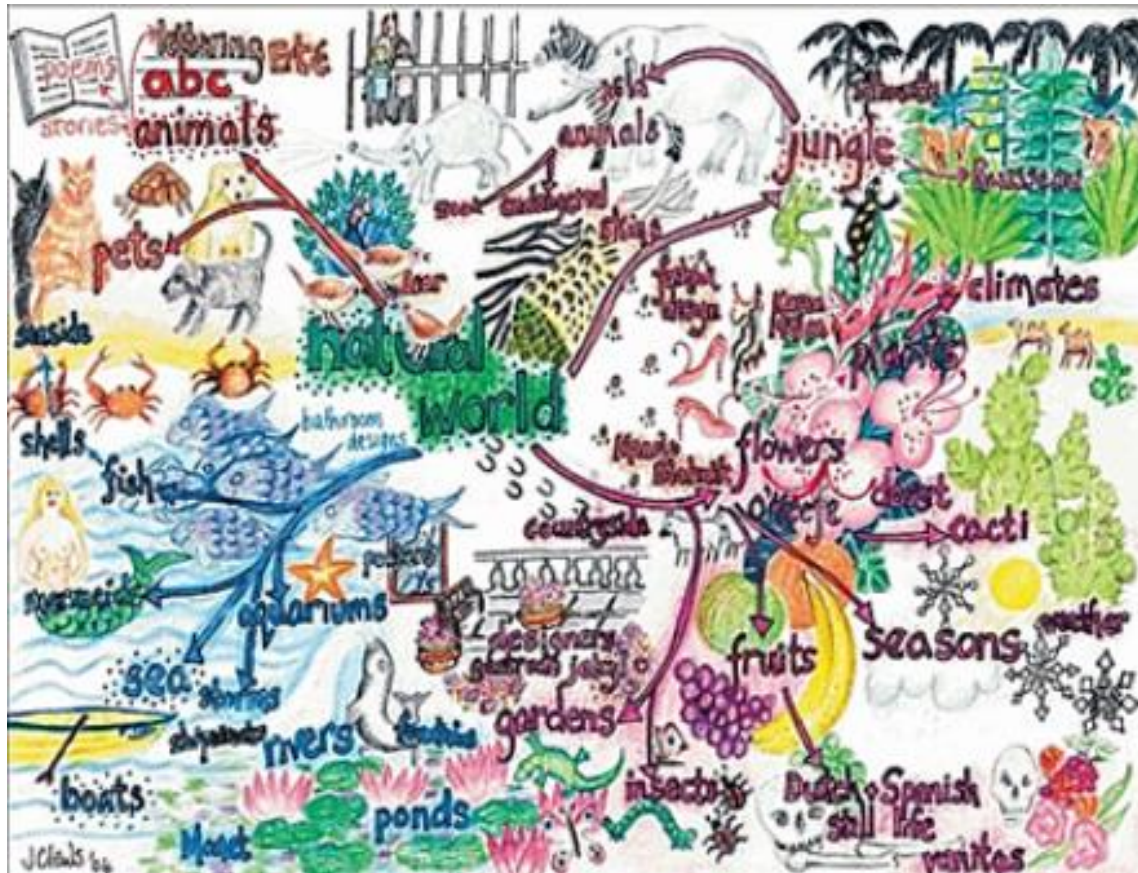


Art about you....
