Synoptic assessment

The mandatory synoptic unit requires you to apply learning from across the qualification to the completion of a defined vocational task.

For Unit 2: Fitness Training and Programming for Health, Sport and Well-being, you will interpret lifestyle factors and health screening data to develop and justify a fitness training programme and nutritional advice for a client. You will complete the task using knowledge and understanding from

your studies of the sector and apply both transferable and specialist knowledge and skills. Unit 3 Professional Development in the Sports Industry and Unit 5 Application of Fitness Testing are both internally assessed units, therefore assignments are all coursework based.

Unit 1 Anatomy and Physiology (Externally assessed)

AO5 Make connections between body systems in response to short-term and long-term exercise and sport participation. Make connections between muscular and all other systems, cardiovascular and respiratory systems, energy and cardiovascular systems

Command words: analyse, assess, discuss, evaluate, to what extent

Marks: 8 marks
