

Increasing prayer space provision

For many institutions it may be impractical to request dedicated space or renovation for a new prayer, meditation or reflection facility both with regards to resources and space.

You may also be in a situation where you have a fantastic provision on one site however you have multiple campuses where there is not the same level of facilities.

In such circumstances working with your institution to find suitable space for students to use at required times can be a useful alternative.

Some examples of increasing prayer space provision are:

- Working with facilities management services to book out unused teaching rooms at specified times throughout the day
- Booking out unused rooms on multiple campuses across sites that can be used by students
- Advertising the rooms available for use via posters, online, emails to students, through the Chaplaincy
- If a lecture is going to start/finish around a set prayer time, book the lecture room with 30 minutes either side and notify students they can pray there before or after class.
- Providing a guide to worship in the local area(s) including approximate times and distance of travel so that students can use the existing provisions in the community
