Student Executives

1. Student Executives have delegated authority from Union Council for the functioning and budget of their specific areas
2. Student Executives allow student leadership of specific areas of the unions work
3. Student Executives will be led by a voluntary officer elected by all students
4. Student Executives will submit a report to each meeting of Union Council which should cover expenditure and decisions taken by the executive between each council
5. Where places on an executive are reserved to a specific demographic of students, eligibility to hold that position shall be based either the Universities data or that member self-defining into a position.
 - 5.1. The Liberations Voluntary Officer shall be reserved for a self-defining woman.
6. Minutes of all meetings of Student Executives should be kept.
7. Union staff members may, where necessary, attend Student Executive meetings but will not have a vote
 1. Temporary instructions
 - a. It is intended that the majority of the positions on the student executives shall be decided by students
 - b. In the first year of functioning of the student executives'; members other than the lead Voluntary officers may be co-opted onto an executive to ensure its correct functioning. The process for co-opting members onto Executives shall be decided by the Union Executive.
 - c. This clause (1 a, b,c) shall be removed from the bye-laws at the end of the 16/17 academic year (June 30th 2017).
