I'm a final year student and the part-time **Widening Participating Officer**.

I ran because, as a **working class, self-defining Black woman** who attended a **comprehensive school in Liverpool**, I really struggled to fit in at Bristol.

I don't want students to feel isolated because of their identity.

I'm passionate about removing barriers to under-represented groups, and ensuring students' experiences at university is inclusive and support all **intersectional identities**.

This year I have represented students from non-traditional backgrounds and headed the Black and Minority Ethnic students Committee and have loved every minute of my role.

I have actively campaigned for liberation, anti-racism and discrimination, curriculum diversity and student welfare.

I'm currently in the process of helping plan for *Accommodation Bursaries* to protect low-income students from financial hardship.

I have the experience from my activism and campaigning to be your Full-Time Officer.

6 POINT PLAN

1. Mental Health & Liberation

- Work with student health services to establish specific facilities for **liberation-based mental ill health issues**
- Introduce **self-care** and **mindfulness workshops** with support from student groups like Peace of Mind Society
- **Pioneer liberation networks** in which students and staff come together to discuss mental health experiences

2. Support Disabled Students & Services

- Lobby for the University to match the **Disabled Students Allowance (DSA)**
- Work with the Disabled Students Officer to establish a **Disabled Students Network**

3. Liberation and Welfare Campaigns

- **Organise campaigns** and events to **raise awareness** on racism, Islamophobia, Anti-Semitism, homophobia, and sexual harassment and assault on campuses
- Create an **online mechanism** that enables students to *report incidences of racism, sexual harassment and homophobia easily and anonymously*
- Launch a liberation based **student-wide consultation** into the safe space policy to make it more representative, inclusive and transparent
- **Stand** against the **Prevent Agenda**

Dedication to Diversity</h3> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Host events and talks from keynote speakers celebrating and discussing topics with liberation and intersectional identities e.g. <i>Immigration and Depression</i> - Lobby the University to increase student diversity to include more students from working class, non-traditional backgrounds and different ethnicities - Work with the Education Officer to have a diverse, liberated and representative curriculum e.g. <i>Why is My Curriculum White</i>
