Outline of the role:

The President and Vice Presidents of your Students' Union work full-time and are elected for one year (though you can run for re-election for a second term). Any registered Middlesex University London student can stand for this position - whether you're a final year looking for a graduate job, or taking a year out of your studies to fulfil the role.

The President is the figurehead of the Student's Union and leads the team of three Vice Presidents officers, and is the first point of contact for the University for campus wide issues. They also chair the Trustee Board and Executive Committee.

In this role, you will meet regularly with senior University management and community leaders on student and campus issues. You oversee the work of the Officer team, Chair the Trustee Board and sit on the University's governing board.

Responsibilities:

- Lead the full-time Student Officer team, working alongside them to campaign for change on campus wide issues
- Act as a spokesperson and figure head of MDXSU to the university and local community
- Chair the MDXSU Board of Trustees (like all charities, MDXSU has a Board of Trustees who
 oversee our work and finances)
- Chair the MDXSU Student Leaders Conference
- Lead priority campaigns to promote change for the benefit of students, and support all campaigns organised by the Union
- Attend regular meetings with members of staff across the university including the senior executive - to talk about issues affecting students, and ensure students are considered in all the university does
- Gather student views, opinions, ideas and feedback
- Work in the direction of the vision, mission, values and strategic priorities of the Students' Union
- Represent individuals, groups and the body of students to the University, National Union of Students, community and policy forming bodies, including attending meetings of such organisations;
- Champion liberation, equality, diversity and inclusion
- · Attend training courses and other opportunities for personal and professional development;
- Attend meetings as appropriate to plan activities and review progress
