<b>SRC Notes</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. In the modern age, it is not difficult to use technology to capture lectures.</li><li>2. Labs and tutorials may be more difficult, but not impossible.</li><li>3. If video is not possible, then audio can often be used.</li><li>4. Having access to lecture capture is often very useful for students who face the most barriers to their education - students with disabilities, mental health issues, student parents, part-time students - and even those with short term illnesses.</li></ol>
<b>SRC Believes</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Some lecturers have been doing this already and noticed no change in attendance.</li><li>2. Live-streaming has been shown by lecturers to improve attendance and engagement.</li><li>3. Abertay is often self-described as the 'digital-university' and 'Choosing its own path' so it would be ideal to build on that by innovating and exploring lecture capture.</li></ol>
