Expanding the Counselling Service

- Lobby the University to direct more funding to the Counselling Service, in order to:
- Reduce waiting times by employing more staff
- Ensure that the service caters for BME and LGBTQ+ students by diversifying our counsellors

Diversifying and consolidating sexual health services

- Secure provision of dental dams and female condoms through Sexpression
- Provide information sessions tailored to international students, covering topics like available health services
- Ensure the roles of the Advice Service, Sexpression and the SU are cohesive, including a fair distribution of funding

Tackling food on campus

- Increase provision for special dietary requirements, such as more vegan options.
- Campaign for lower prices, or an end to the campus food monopoly

Rationalising the mitigating circumstances system

- Ensure processes are applied fairly and consistently across schools
- Address the ambiguity of rules for ongoing issues such as chronic illness or mental health problems, and fight to provide better protection for students affected by these
- Lobby for reimbursement of the cost of doctor's notes

Increasing awareness of support available

- Improve advertisement of the Advice Service and Wellbeing Rooms and what they offer (did you know the Advice Service offers free pregnancy tests?), for example by ensuring this information is included in welcome week packs
- Introduce a comprehensive timetable of workshops and activities across campus, pulling together Sports, Counselling Service workshops, wellbeing activities, and workshops in the business school and Library.
