# Artists' biographies



Born on the Channel Island of Guernsey, **David Le Page** began playing the violin at the age of seven. His eclectic approach to writing, arranging and performing has been formed by an interest in many musical genres; from baroque and folk through to jazz, contemporary classical and

experimental rock. A passion for audience inclusion and a readiness to blur the edges of musical boundaries have contributed to his unique approach to programming. This combines a rare ability to present audiences with something new and challenging whilst allowing them to feel relaxed and engaged. He appears regularly as a soloist, chamber musician and orchestral leader and has formed his own groups, the Le Page Ensemble, The Harborough Collective, Subway Piranhas and Mysterious Barricades. David is Artistic Director and leader of the Stratford-Upon-Avon based Orchestra of the Swan. He plays on a violin made in 1874 by Jean-Baptiste Vuillaume.

Since the foundation of the Company in 1978, the Chorus of Opera North has established a reputation for quality and versatility. As one of the Company's core artistic ensembles, the Chorus features in most Opera North productions at Leeds Grand Theatre, touring the north of England regularly and often travelling to Scotland, Northern Ireland and London. Festival appearances have included Aldeburgh, Edinburgh, Wiesbaden, Ravenna and Bregenz. The Chorus often gives concerts and recitals in the Howard Assembly Room, as well as in other venues in Leeds and on tour. Recent Chorus-centred projects include the participative online workshops From Couch to Chorus and ONe-to-ONe during lockdown; co-productions with Leeds Playhouse of Sondheim's A Little Night Music and Into the Woods in the Quarry Theatre; the UK premiere of Kevin Puts' opera Silent Night at Leeds Town Hall and the world premiere of Jessica Walker's Not Such Quiet Girls in the Howard Assembly Room, both part of Leeds' Armistice 100 commemorations; Berlin to Broadway in a co-production with West Yorkshire Playhouse at the City Varieties Music Hall; and Gilbert & Sullivan's Trial by Jury in the Little Greats season of six short operas in 2017.
