## Math:

Play "Cookies for Santa (More Than>Less Than)." Two children play and each has a
paper plate. They take turns rolling one or two dice (depending on their age) and putting
that many "cookies" (or pretend cookies) on their plate. They estimate which plate has
the most cookies and then count and repeat. For older students, use 3 or 4 dice.

# **Social Studies:**

- Plan a holiday celebration, including with a budget of real or play money.
- Read Cuadros de familia/Family Pictures. Act out or make a song about some of the traditions. Create your own family picture and story.

#### Science:

Compare animals that can fly to reindeer.
