ABOUT THE PERFORMANCE

Apollo Chamber Players bring the rich global history of Texas to life in this musical Texas History program. Folk music from Greece, Ireland, the Czech Republic, Mexico, and others are performed, as students and Apollo musicians construct a huge quilt with the flags from each of these immigrant communities that settled in the Texas region, alongside historical trivia, and thought-provoking discussion.

Academic Vocabulary:

Sirtaki	* A popular dance of Greek origin, choreographed by Giorgos Provias for the 1964 film Zorba the Greek. The dance is based on traditional Greek musical traditions. Often the dancers are in a line or circle with their arms on each other's shoulders.
Jig	*A folkdance, usually solo, that was popular in Scotland and northern England in the 16th and 17th centuries and in Ireland since the 18th century. It is an improvised dance performed with rapid footwork and a rigid torso.
Reel	* A folk-dance type as well as the accompanying dance tune type. The Virginia Reel a lively American country dance performed by several couples facing each other in parallel lines.
Polka	* A lively Czech dance of Bohemian origin in duple time. Mexican polka is called "conjunto."
Mariachi	*Traditional Mexican folk music, a mix of numerous regional music styles and dances, usually performed by a strolling band of musicians. Mariachi song forms include the <i>bolero</i> and <i>canción ranchera</i> .

- What do you think of when you think of Texas music?
- Does anyone know a folksong, especially one learned from your family?
- Where do you think people originally came from who now live in Texas?

After the performance:

- What did you learn from the presentation?
- Write, draw, tell, sing, dance, or act out your favorite part.

- Read, research, write about, and discuss Texas cultures.

Math:

- Create a quilt design, using geometric shapes.

Social Studies:

- On a map/globe, find where different Texas groups originated. Create paths to show how they got to Texas.
- Research Native American music in Texas.
- Research Negro spirituals.
- Find out more about the traditions of different ethnic groups in Texas.

Science:

- Learn how sound is produced by string instruments.
- Create simple string instruments and experiment with how to make the sound higher or lower.
