Pavol Kubáň Baritone



The Slovakian baritone Pavol Kubáň began his studies in his home country, followed by studies in Bologna.

He is member of the ensemble of the National Theatre in Prague, where he performed Jupiter in Rameau's *Platée*, Valentin in Gounod's *Faust* and the leading role in *The Charlatan* by Pavel Haas. His repertoire include the principal baritone roles in operas by Mozart, Rossini, Puccini, Donizetti and Rachmaninov.

Recently he made his debuts as Jaufré Rudel in Kaija Saariaho's L'amour de loin in Brno, Robert in Tchaikovsky's lolanta and Zurga in Les pêcheurs de perles at the Liberec Opera. In Brno, he sang the role

of Šiškov in Janáček's From the House of the Dead under the direction of Jakob Hruša.

In addition to his engagements at the National Theatre in Prague, guest performances have taken him to Germany, Italy and Switzerland.

Pavol Kubáň is a prizewinner and finalist in international singing competitions, including the Hans Gabor Singing Competition and the International Music Competition in Montreal.
