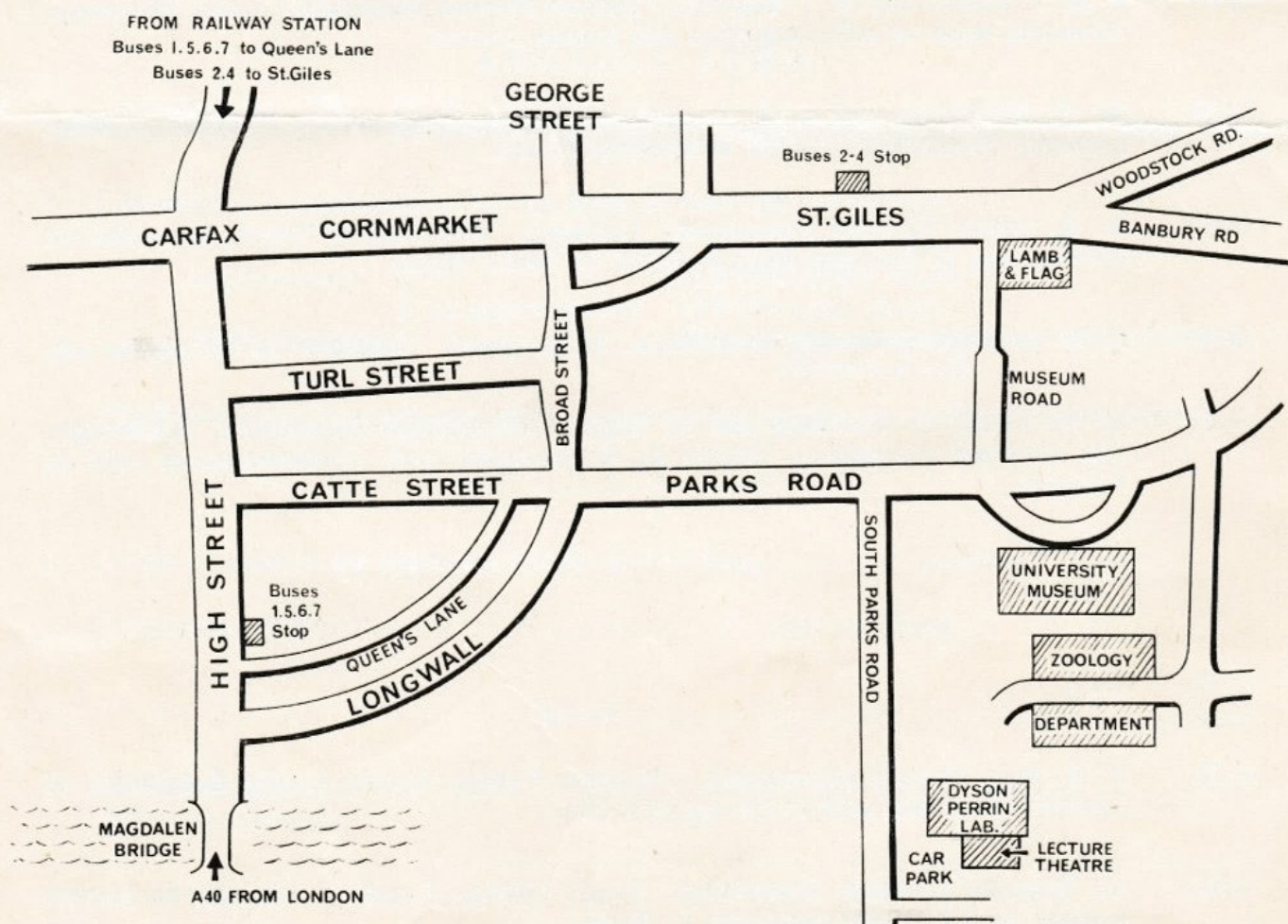
The Conference Office will be open from 10.00 in the Zoology Department, where coffee and tea will be served.
