Located in the heart of BD1 and immediately adjacent to Forster Square retail park, the scheme is only 10 minutes' walk from the fantastic amenities of the £260m Broadway shopping centre. The railway station at Forster Square is under 10 minutes' walk, providing regular services direct to Leeds city centre with a journey time of 25 minutes.

The restoration and refurbishment of this Grade II listed building is undertaken by

experienced local developer Priestley Homes, who have a wealth of knowledge and expertise in this sector and a track record of completed developments including; James St Apartments, Airedale House, The Grand Mill and Quebec Street in Bradford, Boyds Mill, Kirkstall Design Centre and Hanover House in Leeds, Stableford Hall and Sartoria Court in Manchester and Jameson House in Sunderland.

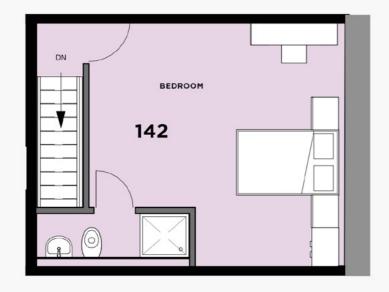

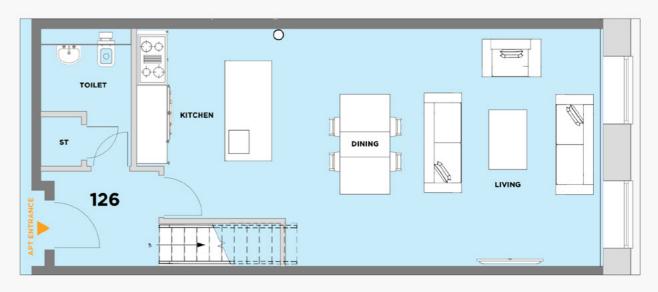

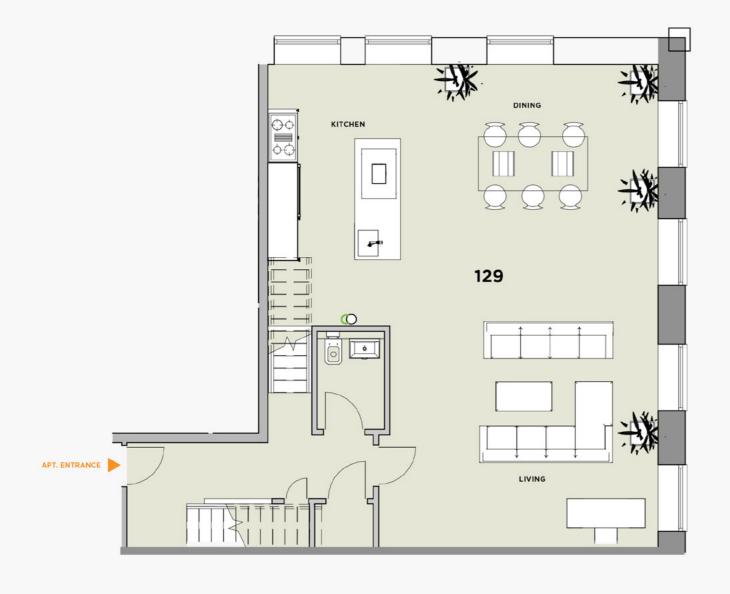

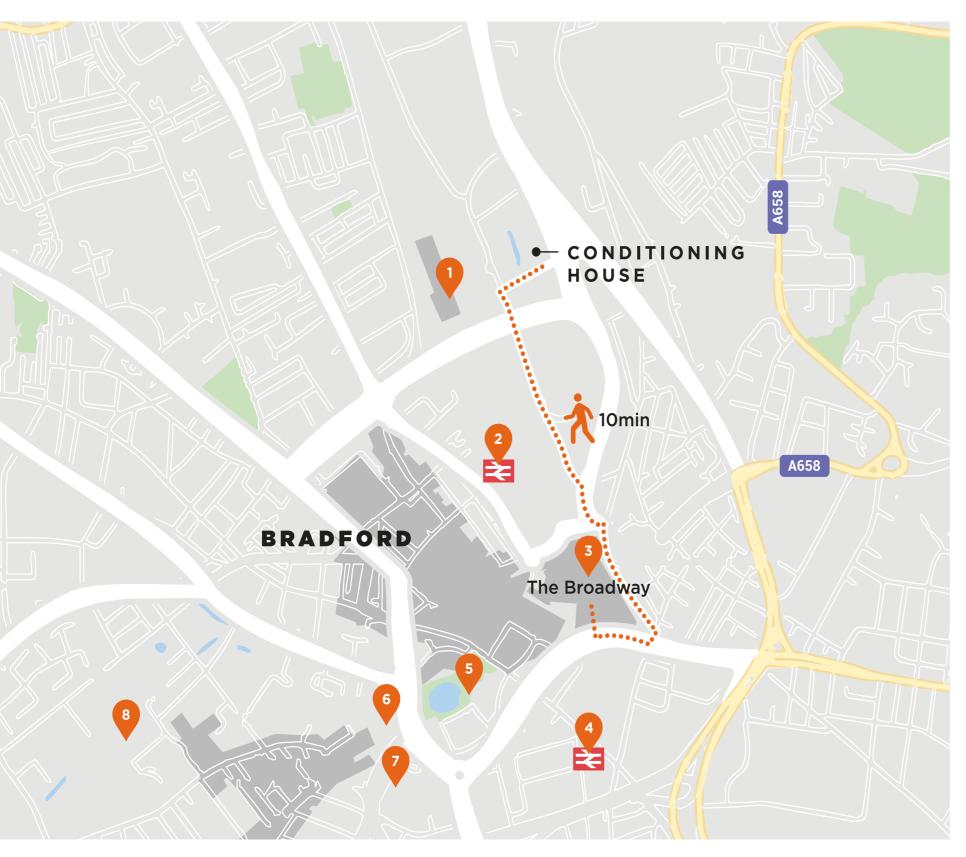

#### **ABOUT**

### Bradford is the fifth largest city authority in the UK with a population of over half a million and an economy worth £9.5bn.<sup>1</sup>

Several major companies have their headquarters in Bradford district – including FTSE 100 companies Morrisons and Provident Financial - Yorkshire Building Society, Hallmark Cards, Arris (Pace), Freemans Grattan Holdings and Yorkshire Water. Over 40 large companies are headquartered in the District employing 370,000 people across the UK with a combined turnover of £30billion.

Formerly considered to be the wool capital of the world, Bradford is now proud to be recognised twice by UNESCO – as the world's first city of film

and the site of the Victorian mill and village complex, Saltaire. Conditioning House, benefits from its immediate proximity to all the culture Bradford has to offer including the National Media Centre, historic Alhambra Theatre, Bradford Cathedral, Impressions Art Gallery, I-max cinema and Bradford City FC.

#### **LOCATION**

Bradford is centrally positioned with direct access to the major cities of the UK and beyond; by road – To M62 (for Leeds, Manchester and Liverpool) is 5 miles. To A1 (for Newcastle and Scotland) is 20 miles and to M1 (for Birmingham and London) is 13 miles; by rail - Bradford Interchange to Manchester Piccadilly is 1h 24m, Birmingham New Street 2h 29m and London Kings Cross 2h 53m; by air – Leeds Bradford

International Airport is only 8 miles from the city centre and annually serves 4million passengers to over 70 destinations.<sup>2</sup>

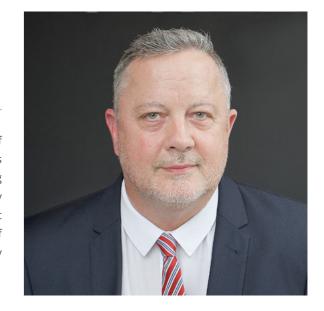

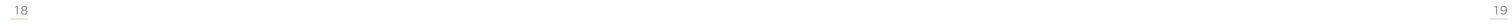

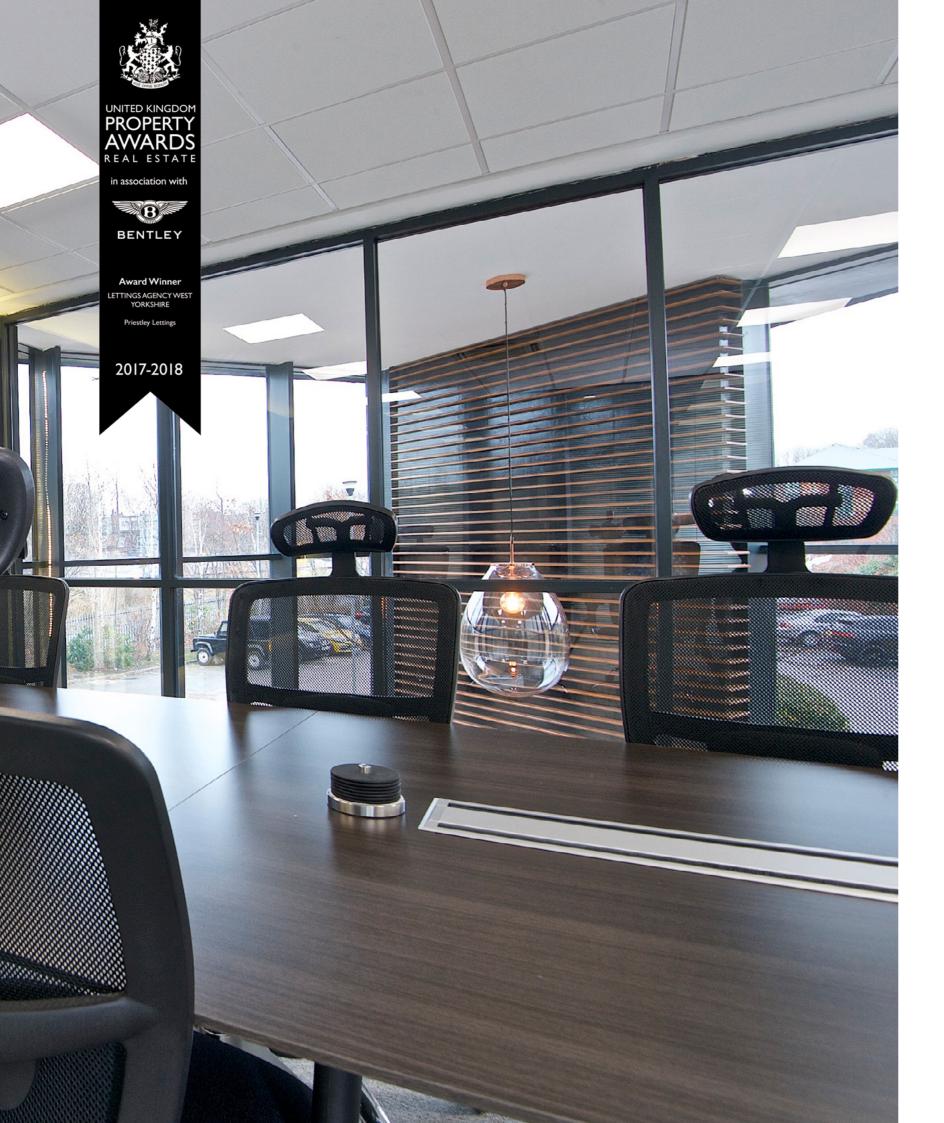

Situated on the corner of Cape Street in the centre of Bradford and Grade II listed, The Conditioning House was built by the Corporation on continental precedents to check and control the moisture content of textiles by means of laboratory examination and certify their true weight and length. It is the only one of its kind in this country. The service was established in 1887 and the

Conditioning House was purpose built 1900-02 by the city architect F E P Edwards to the designs of F Wild who died in 1901. The building is erected on 4-storeys and basement around 3 sides of an open court. Restrained detailing with elements of the Queen Anne style.<sup>1</sup>
