



Pupil Premium Funding 2015-16

In 2015-16 our allocation for Pupil Premium was £28,340.

How the money was spent:

- A part-time Teaching Assistant ran a targeted, daily reading intervention with PP pupils across the school.
- A part-time teacher (1 day per week) provided small group and 1:1 support in core subjects, as necessary. This involved running intervention groups and/or supporting PP children in class.
- A Parent Support Advisor worked with families to increase their participation and involvement in their children's education and to help them support their children's learning both at school and at home.
- Subsidised activities in school were provided.
- An additional Lunch Break Supervisor supported the social and emotional needs of disadvantaged pupils so that they were ready to learn when lessons began again.
- The Deputy Head was allocated increased time for leadership of disadvantaged pupils and to provide targeted support.

Impact

Disadvantaged pupils at KS1 (3 pupils) made good progress and reached the expected standard. One of the three pupils achieved greater depth in each subject.

Not all of the 4 pupils at KS2 reached the expected standard in reading, writing or maths.

KS2 (2 pupils): one pupil made good progress but the other pupil made weak progress due to extenuating circumstances.
