



Pupil Premium Funding 2014-15

This year our allocation for Pupil Premium was £17,648.

How the money was spent:

- A part-time teaching assistant ran a targeted, daily reading intervention with PP pupils across the school.
- A part-time teacher provided small group and 1:1 support in core subjects. This involved running intervention groups and supporting PP children in class.
- A Parent Support Advisor worked with families to increase their participation and involvement in their children's education and to help them support their children's learning both at school and at home.
- Subsidised activities in school that incurred a cost.

Impact in Key Stage 1

Pupil Premium Pupils (7 children) are in line with or above national averages in reading and maths but FSM are 0.5 below in writing. There are individual case studies in school to explain this further.

Impact in Key Stage 2
