Acceptable Internet Use Policy - Pupils & Parents

Pupil Agreement

As a school user of the Internet, I agree to keep to the rules on its use.

- I will use the school network in a responsible way.
- I will always ask an adult before I use the internet.
- I will search using www.learningalive.co.uk
- I will only let my friends and family know where I live, my phone number, email address or where I go to school. I will not tell strangers this information.
- I will only accept emails and messages from people I know.
- If I feel scared, unhappy or uncomfortable about anything I see on the internet, I follow these steps:
 - 1) Turn off the monitor
 - 2) Tell an adult/teacher/parent straight away
 - 3) Return to computer when I'm allowed

Acceptable Internet Use

- Always ask a grown up before you use the internet. They can help you find the best thing to do.
- Search using www.learninglive.co.uk
- Only let your friends and family know where you live, your phone number, email address or where you go to school. Don't tell strangers this information.
- Only send photos of you, your friends or your family to people you really know. Don't send pictures to strangers.
- Only accept emails from people you know.
- If you feel scared, unhappy or uncomfortable about anything you see on the internet, follow these steps:
 - 1) Turn off your monitor
 - 2) Tell an adult straight away
 - 3) Return to computer when allowed



Parent/Carer Agreement

As the parent/carers of the pupil signing above, I grant permission for my child to use electronic mail and the Internet at school. I agree to help reinforce the issues contained in the Pupil Acceptable Internet Use agreement when my child uses the internet at home.

I understand that:

- Pupils will be held accountable for their own actions.
