From September 2013 schools have received additional money for sport.

- Links with other subjects that contribute to pupils' overall achievement and their greater social, spiritual, moral and cultural skills
- Greater awareness amongst pupils about of obesity, smoking and other factors that undermine health
- Continuing and developing Healthy School and Sports Mark PE initiatives
- Extending our provision by providing extra staffing/support and training for sports and coaching

## Summary of spending 2015/ 16:

We provided free, open to all and therefore inclusive out of school sports clubs. We have good levels of participation in sports beyond the minimum required in school time.

We have offered pupils the opportunity to represent the school and compete in a range of sporting opportunities. In order to make these opportunities sustainable we have developed procedures around parents helping with transport.

We purchased a new scheme of work. We trained staff in how to deliver the scheme, use equipment and developed team skills in PE which will make these developments sustainable.

We have offered a greater range of sports experience than could be offered by the school budget and parents' contributions.

## Impact Statement:

As a result of these and other measures participation PE, sports and games is very good. Records show almost every child in KS2 took part in a sports club last year. "In school" competitions have led (with support and high quality coaching) into participation of as many teams as possible in all available competitions. The school has experienced a number of area and regional sporting successes over recent years.

As a result of the quality of the teaching and learning and the range of sporting experiences and challenges the School was awarded the School Games Gold Award in 2014/15.
