The year seems to be flying and it is hard to believe that it is March already! This is the term when the children eagerly anticipate the school field being dry enough for them to start playing on it. Let's just hope we do have some more lovely spring weather again which will help this happen as quickly as possible!

We have a lot of residential this half term – five in total – which is quite a challenge to organise. We have Year 5 children heading off to Unna, Germany and Cordoba Spain. We also have 30 adults and children going on the skiing residential to the French Alps and 96 of our Year 3 & 4 children enjoying an overnight visit to the Roman Wall. The show is about a man and his goat who are travelling storytellers and they act out three stories from French speaking countries, namely Mali, Quebec and Cambodia. In the weeks leading up to the show, the children have worked hard in French lessons practising the songs and raps, and learning vocabulary to help them understand the plot. This really paid off on the day, as they could really get involved in the action and I was so proud to see them all singing along in French. Our partner school there is built on the shores of a lake (which was totally frozen when we were there) and they have an ice rink in their grounds! During our time there, we experienced some of the wonderful Finnish education system and also shared our approaches to teaching writing with each of the eight countries.

Myself, Mr McLoughlin, Mr Graham and Mr Gill will be joining them all for the last few days of the visit for work being undertaken in our partner school as well as a transnational meeting.
